## WHAT IS A HOKIE?

That's the most often-asked question regarding Virginia Tech.

The answer leads all the way back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical

College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute.

With the change came the necessity for writing a new cheer and a contest for such a purpose was held by the student body.

Senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his "Hokie" yell which still is used today. Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any meaning to it, Stull explained the word was solely the product of his imagination and was only used as an attention-getter for his yell.

It soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those loyal to Tech athletics.

## DIRECTIONS TO BLACKSBURG

**From the north or east**, take Interstate 81 south to exit 118B, following US 460 west to Blacksburg.

**From the south**, take Interstate 81 north to exit 118B, following US 460 west to Blacksburg.

**From West Virginia**, take Interstate 77 south (West Virginia Turnpike) to exit 9. Exit and turn left onto 460 east. Follow 460 east to Blacksburg.

**Once in Blacksburg**, use the 460 bypass around the downtown area. Follow 460 to the signal at Southgate Drive (Va. 314). Turn into campus, and proceed one-half mile on Southgate Drive. Turn left onto Spring Road at the signal, just before the football stadium. Tech Softball Park will then be on the left, across the street from Lane Stadium.

# 2006 PREVIEW

## INFIELD

### HEADLINES

- A year after being completely revamped, the infield returns almost fully intact and with more depth.
- **Stephanie Savre** returns at first base. She swings a powerful bat from the left side, hitting nine home runs a year ago. **Beth Walker** or **Ashley Thatcher** could also be used here.
- **Caitlin Murphy**, **Allyson Campbell** and **Erin Ota** will battle for playing time at second base. Murphy earned all-conference honors two years ago for her production at the plate. Campbell earned her playing time last season as a dependable pinch runner, scoring 11 runs. Ota is a speedy freshman from California who will see a lot of action this year.
- **Alisia Narodowski** returns at shortstop. The transfer from Lake City Community College gets a good jump on the ball and has a quick release.
- **Charisse Mariconda** enters the season as the starter at third base. She is a highly touted recruit from Florida who swings a good bat and plays excellent defense.
- **Dori Nunley** is an invited walk-on who is scheduled to redshirt this year while working at third base.

### COACH THOMAS ON THE INFIELDER

"We have some experience coming back, but we also have a lot of youth in the infield. We're going to be more athletic and you'll see this group getting to a lot of balls. We have a lot of depth and I think we've improved as a whole. Three starters return in Caitlin, Alisia and Stephanie, but we also have good young talent in Charisse, Erin, Dori and Beth. So while this group was a question mark going into last season, I think we're going to be a very good and much improved group this year."

## OUTFIELD

### HEADLINES

- The outfield will have five letterwinners returning.
- **Kelly Brown** was the spark plug at the top of the lineup last year and anchors the right field position. She set a new school record for hits in a season (76) in 2005.
- Speedy **Callie Rhodes** returns after missing the 2005 season with a knee injury. She will be a threat on the basepaths as she had 31 stolen bases in 2004.
- **Theresa Walsh** is perhaps the best fielder of any of the Hokies and can play any of the three positions. She brings speed and a left-handed bat to the lineup.
- The surprise of last year was walk-on **Caroline Stolle**, who ended up starting 49 games in left field. She also had eight home runs and improved dramatically in the field as the season progressed.
- **Crystal Beach** spent her first two years at third base, but moved to right field last season. She has seen most of her action on the base paths.
- Freshmen **Jessica Everhart**, **Beth Walker** and **Jenna Rhodes** will all battle for playing time in the outfield. All have the ability to contribute at the plate and in the field.

## PITCHERS

### HEADLINES

- All four pitchers from 2005 return to a staff that posted a 2.34 ERA.
- Sophomore **Angela Tincher** returns after a record-setting rookie campaign. Last year, she broke the school record for strikeouts and saves in a season and will look to continue her strong play.
- **Katie Maynard** also returns as the co-No. 1 pitcher. She went 18-13 a year ago, but must strive for consistency if she wants to finish her career on a high note.
- **Karie Morrison** and **Megan Stone** made improvements last season and must continue to build on the momentum gained. Both will be counted on for help throughout the year.
- The final spot in the rotation could be taken by JUCO transfer **Ashley Thatcher**, who earned NFCA Cal JC All-America honors last year. She could also play in the field and hit eight home runs a year ago.

### COACH HORNAK ON THE PITCHERS

"I'm excited about the potential this pitching staff has. We return all four pitchers from last year's staff and add a quality transfer in Ashley Thatcher. Angela Tincher and Katie Maynard are going to be counted on for big things this year. They have to be consistent and give us good efforts for this team to be successful. Angela has all the tools to be a great pitcher and Katie has shown flashes of dominance. And if Karie Morrison and Megan Stone can pitch in and give us good outings, this staff can be very good."

## CATCHERS

### HEADLINES

- Replacing all-everything Megan Evans will not be easy, but several players will battle for that spot.
- Sophomore **Kelsey Hoffman** brings the most experience to the position after backing up Evans a year ago. She saw action at first and third base, as well as behind the plate and as the designated player. She hit .239 with 20 RBI and seven doubles.
- **Kelsy Rokey** will battle Hoffman for the starting nod behind the plate. The Arizona native should be a strong addition to the Hokies both at the plate and in the field.
- **Morgan Harris** and **Kendal Martin** are a pair of Virginia products who bring a good work ethic to the team. Both will help with the pitching staff, serving as bullpen catchers.

### COACH THOMAS ON THE CATCHERS

"Replacing Megan Evans' bat is going to be hard. I feel we have two very good catchers, Kelsey Hoffman and Kelsy Rokey who, defensively, are ready to step in. Both will be vying for time as a starter and I think we're probably as strong defensively as we've ever been with our top two catchers. Hoffman does a nice job receiving the pitchers and hit the ball well in the fall while Rokey has a strong arm and has a little more power in her bat. We're going to lose the 10-15 home runs Megan gave us, but these two will get the job done. And we have two great bullpen catchers in Morgan and Kendal. Both of them have tremendous attitudes and will be valuable assets this season."

Now entering his 11th season, Scot Thomas has positioned Hokie softball as one of the most respected programs, not only in the state and region, but on the national map as well. With seven winning seasons under his belt, including last year's NCAA Regional team, Thomas will look to take a senior-laden group back to the postseason.

Last season, Tech picked up 44 wins and was selected to the NCAA Tournament, a first in the program's history. After finishing seventh in the conference, the Hokies made a dramatic run to the championship game to secure the bid. Three players earned all-region honors and over two dozen school records were broken by either the team or individuals.

In 2004, he led Tech to its sixth winning season while picking up his 300th win, which came in dramatic fashion against in-state rival Virginia. Three players earned All-BIG EAST honors while two took home all-region

accolades as Tech posted a 36-23 record.

In 2002, Thomas led the Hokies to their third 40-win season and a runner-up finish at the BIG EAST Softball Championship. After a magical run in the BIG EAST Softball Championship, the Hokies claimed the No. 2 spot in the final NCAA East Region poll.

Thomas became Tech's first head softball coach when he was hired on July 7, 1995. In that time, he has recorded 346

wins, averaged 35 wins per season and made the conference tournament championship game five times.

In 1996, his first season, he led a team of non-scholarship athletes to a respectable 16-32 record, a total not indicative of the progress made in just one season.

The Hokies finished a spectacular 1999 season ranked 25th in the nation with a 54-16 record. In just its fourth year as a varsity sport, the team placed second at the A-10 tournament, falling to Massachusetts for the second year in a row. For his team's play, Thomas was named the Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year.

The Hokies' hopes for a regional at-large bid were denied, but they did receive the national attention they had been working for. An upset of No. 4 Michigan highlighted the season. Tech finished the year undefeated at home and 14-2 in Atlantic 10 play, losing only to UMass. The Hokies had the third-longest winning streak in the nation at 26, and at one point won 35 of 36 games.

In 2000, his first recruiting class left its mark on the program as the Hokies went 41-22 and finished second in the A-10 Tournament. Atlantic 10 Player of the Year and two-time GTE National First-Team Academic All-American Michelle Meadows led the team both on the field and off.

While success on the field is important, Thomas also places a strong emphasis on success in the classroom. In 10 seasons, he has had three players earn Academic All-America honors. Michelle Johnson made the 1998 second-team squad while Meadows was a three-time selection, the last two being on the first team. Following the 2002 season, Ashlee Dobbe earned first-team honors with her 3.8 GPA.

In the 1999-2000 season, the Hokies finished tied for ninth in the nation for team grade point average. That team posted an average GPA of 3.28, tying the Hokies with Southeast Missouri State.

Respected by many, Thomas has been named the Virginia State Coach of the Year by the Virginia Sports Information Directors four times (1999, 2000, 2002 & 2005). In that time, he has had over 17 different players named to the all-state team, including three on every team in seven of the last eight seasons.

Thomas graduated from East Tennessee State University in 1991 with a bachelor's in physical education. He is on the Louisville Slugger advisory staff for the 10th straight year.

In the past, he has served as the BIG EAST Conference's representative for the NFCA weekly top 25 poll. He also was a voter in the ESPN/USA Softball Top 25 poll this past year. This past summer, he was selected to be the head coach of a group of local collegiate all-stars who took on the U.S. Olympic Softball Team in Salem, Va.

Thomas is also an active ballplayer in the fastpitch world, playing in the ASA Men's B Nationals in 2003 and the NSA World Series in 2004 and 2005.

A native of Blacksburg, Va., Thomas graduated from Blacksburg High where he was a member of the football and baseball teams. He is married to the former Carolyn Croy, a Tech graduate from Blacksburg. The couple has a son, Andrew Scot, who is 8, and a daughter, Eliza Leigh, who turned 4 in November.

Christine Hornak begins her second season as the top assistant for the Virginia Tech softball team. Hornak will be responsible for the pitching staff, as well as conditioning, recruiting and coordinating all travel plans.

Hornak came to Blacksburg after spending the past two seasons as the pitching coach at Campbell University, where she was a softball standout.

Last year, she helped transform a young staff into a consistent group, including record-setting freshman Angela Tinchler, who earned all-region honors after finishing third in the nation in strikeouts per seven innings.

A native of St. Louis, Mo., Hornak was a star pitcher at Campbell from 1994-95. She then transferred to UNC Greensboro where she earned a degree in psychology in 1998.

Prior to returning to Campbell as the pitching coach, Hornak spent two years serving as a volunteer pitching coach at Greensboro College. In two seasons pitching at Campbell, Hornak amassed a career record of

43-19 with a school-best 1.20 earned run average. She holds the school record for shutouts with 19. Hornak also ranks in the top 10 in appearances (69), games started (53), complete games (51), innings pitched (398) and strikeouts (245).

A two-time first-team all-conference selection, she helped lead CU's 1995 squad to a school-best 41 wins, a conference tournament title and a berth in the NCAA tournament. Hornak was named the conference tournament MVP and was named to the regional all-tournament team.

Hornak starred in the circle for UNCG as well, compiling a career record of 52-29 with a 1.78 earned run average. An all-conference selection, Hornak led the Spartans to the 1997 conference championship and a trip to the NCAA tournament, where she was named to the regional all-tournament team once again. She was also named the league's player of the year that same season.

Al Brauns enters his eighth year as an assistant for the Hokies. His responsibilities include working with the outfielders, hitters, field maintenance, equipment and recruiting.

Brauns is a familiar face in Hokie sports, holding a position with the Virginia Tech athletics department for three years prior to joining the softball staff.

Under his direction, numerous players have earned all-state, all-conference and all-region honors. Bronwyn Blair, a four-year starter in centerfield, was drafted by the Tampa Bay FireStix of the WPSL in 2001. Right fielder Kelly Brown was named to the 2003 BIG EAST All-Rookie team and has been named All-Northeast Region the past two seasons.

Last season, the outfield had a fielding percentage of .969, recording 13 outfield assists and committing just six errors all year. Brown and freshman Caroline Stolle led the way with five assists apiece.

This year, he returns four players with starting, including Brown, a two-time all-region selection, Callie Rhodes, who set the school record for stolen bases two years ago before sitting out last year with a knee injury, Stolle, who started 49 games in left field despite never playing in the outfield before coming to Tech, and Theresa Walsh, who can play any of the three positions and is the best defensive outfielder on the team.

Brauns started playing fastpitch in the 1960s and finished his career playing with a men's major team from 1970-74. In the summer of 2003, he coached a men's fastpitch team to a 17th-place national tournament finish where his catcher was Tech head coach Scot Thomas.

Brauns is originally from Uniontown, Pa., and graduated from Penn State in 1973 with a degree in criminology. Brauns and his wife, Michelle, have one child, Adam, who is 13 years old. He also has two other sons, Eric, 37, and Jason, 31. He has two grandchildren, Alaina and Allison.



Regardless of where they are, Virginia Tech sports fans have the luxury of getting up-to-date information on their favorite Tech sports or athletes on a daily basis. hokiesports.com is every Tech fan's source for fast, accurate and official coverage of Hokie softball.

Through the efforts of the sports information department, pregame releases, game stories and individual features — as well as up-to-date statistics and results for the softball team — are posted to hokiesports.com, providing the fastest, most complete source for Hokie news on the Web.

Other offerings include individual home pages for each of Virginia Tech's sports. Breaking news and archived releases about all Tech teams can be found, along with media guides containing player and coaching staff profiles, schedules, records, historical information and other pertinent facts for every sport.

Also, accessible on every sport's home page are the rosters, with links to player bios, schedules and results, as well as conference standings. School single-game, season and career records, Tech Softball Park records and directions to the field are found here. Head coach Scot Thomas also makes good use of the "Coaches Notebook," which is updated as the season progresses, providing fans with an inside view of the softball program.

With fast "live stats," fans can view stats as they happen via the Web. These stats are available for all home games, and selected away games if available. This year, Jerry Massey — the Voice of Tech softball — will call all of Tech's home games on hokietv.com.

## ATLANTIC COAST CONFERENCE

### The Tradition

Consistency. It's the mark of true excellence in any endeavor.

However, in today's intercollegiate athletics, competition has become so balanced and so competitive that it is virtually impossible to maintain a high level of consistency.

Yet the Atlantic Coast Conference has defied the odds. Now in its 53rd year of competition, the ACC has long enjoyed the reputation as one of the strongest and most competitive intercollegiate conferences in the nation. And that is not mere conjecture, the numbers support it.

Since the league's inception in 1953, ACC schools have captured 94 national championships, including 49 in women's competition and 45 in men's. In addition, NCAA individual titles have gone to ACC student-athletes 120 times in men's competition and 60 times in women's action.

### The Championships

The conference will conduct championship competition in 25 sports during the 2005-06 academic year — 12 for men and 13 for women.

The first ACC championship was held in swimming on Feb. 25, 1954. The conference did not conduct championships in cross country, wrestling or tennis during the first year.

The 12 sports for men include football, cross country, soccer, basketball, swimming, indoor and outdoor track, wrestling, baseball,

tennis, golf and lacrosse. Fencing, which was started in 1971, was discontinued in 1981.

Women's sports were initiated in 1977 with the first championship meet being held in tennis at Wake Forest University.

Championships for women are currently conducted in cross country, field hockey, soccer, basketball, swimming, indoor and outdoor track, tennis, golf, lacrosse, softball and rowing.

This year, the eight schools that play softball — Boston College, Florida State, Georgia Tech, North Carolina, North Carolina State, Maryland, Virginia and Virginia Tech — will converge on College Park and the campus of the University of North Carolina for the 2006 ACC Softball Championship, to be held May 11-14 at the UNC Softball Complex.

The winner of the double-elimination tournament will earn the league's automatic berth into the NCAA's 64-team championship field. This will mark the first year the ACC receives an automatic bid.

Last year's event was also held at the Terrapin Softball Complex on Maryland's campus.

Virginia Tech, seeded seventh, knocked off second-seeded Florida State in the opener, winning 4-3 in 14 innings. On Friday, the Hokies then fell into the loser's bracket with a 2-1 defeat at the hands of third-seeded Virginia. Tech then bounced back to knock out, North Carolina, 4-0.

Georgia Tech, Virginia Tech, Florida State and North Carolina earned bids to the NCAA tournament.

Georgia Tech pitcher Jessica Sallinger was named MVP of the event while Virginia Tech's Kelly Brown, Megan Evans and Angela Tincher were each named to the all-tournament team.

# 2005 REVIEW

## Record-breaking season leads to first-ever NCAA Tournament bid

Virginia Tech head softball coach Scot Thomas realized in early February that he had something special on his hands. The Hokies were in the midst of an 18-game winning streak, finding different ways to win games every time out. Great fielding, dominant pitching and timely hitting were all key components to Tech winning four tournaments early on in the season. The Hokies won the Sonic Challenge, the Cougar Classic, the Stetson Tournament and the Hokie Fastpitch Club Classic in running its record to 26-6.

Heading into the Atlantic Coast Conference portion of its schedule, Tech was all but a lock for its first NCAA Tournament appearance in the program's 10-year history.

Then it all fell apart.

Star freshman pitcher Angela Tincher was diagnosed with a pair of stress fractures in her left fibula that sidelined her for three weeks. In her absence, the Hokies faltered and went just 4-13 in conference play, which landed them in the cellar heading into the ACC Tournament.

Luckily, Tincher was able to return in time for the tournament and Tech got its confidence back. In their opener, the Hokies bested second-seeded Florida State in 14 innings, 3-2. Tincher led the way to the win by striking out a tournament-record 21 batters in 12.2 innings. The next day, however, Tech fell to Virginia, putting the team's hopes of reaching the title game on the line.

Yet the Hokies came through again.

Senior catcher Megan Evans blasted two, two-run home runs to lead Tech to a 4-0 win over North Carolina. The next day, the Hokies downed Maryland, 5-3. Later that night, Tincher struck out 16 batters as Tech beat UVa, 2-1, to eliminate the Cavs.

That win led Tech to a berth in the title game, where its run ended with a 1-0 loss against top-seeded Georgia Tech. Katie Maynard allowed just three infield hits, but Tech's bats couldn't solve All-American Jessica Sallinger.

But the Hokies' four wins were good enough to re-ignite the flames of hope for a regional bid.

On the ride home, the team bus pulled over to the side of Interstate 81 so the players could watch the NCAA selection show on the satellite television. As the brackets rolled by, teams Tech had beaten were called, but not Tech.

Finally, with just three brackets left, there it was: Virginia Tech. The dream had become a reality and the players erupted in jubilation. The Hokies were going to the NCAA Tournament, something never before accomplished in the history of the program.

While Tech went just 1-2 at the regional competition hosted by the University of Tennessee at Knoxville, the tournament losses couldn't take away from the outstanding season that saw Tech go 44-25. Tincher re-wrote the school record book, striking out 349 batters on the season. She finished third in the nation in strikeouts per seven innings (12.0) and 19th in the nation in ERA (1.06).

Evans finished her Tech career as the greatest power hitter in the program's history. She broke several school records, including those for career home runs (50), career RBI (161), career walks (121), home runs in a season (16), RBI in a season (50), and slugging percentage. She broke or tied over two dozen records in her illustrious four-year career.

Fittingly, her final at bat in a Tech uniform saw her do what she did best: go deep. After seeing 13 straight balls, resulting in three walks, Evans drove a 1-0 pitch over the left field wall for a home run, coming with two outs in the bottom of the seventh inning of Tech's loss to the College of Charleston.

Outfielder Kelly Brown also set new school marks for hits in a season (76), at bats in a season (236) and hitting streak (24 games). Brown and Evans were both named All-ACC and, along with Tincher, were named All-Northeast Region.

Brown, Tincher and Evans were voted to the Virginia Sports Information Director's (VaSID) all-state team while Thomas was named the Coach of the Year for the fourth time in 10 seasons. Kathleen Jones was honored for her work in the classroom, being named to the *ESPN the Magazine* Academic All-District III team.

the championship game of the Cougar Classic.

Kelsey Hoffman's solo home run against Troy's Jocelyn McCallum, a 2004 Australian Olympian, and Caroline Stolle's RBI single in the eighth inning led to a Hokie win.

Tincher struck out a school-record 22 batters in a nine-inning win over Radford. She also threw a no-hitter in Tech's ACC debut against Maryland, striking out 16.

Stephanie Savre had a walk-off grand slam as Tech upset 18th-ranked Georgia Tech, 9-5.

A school-record 1,977 fans showed up to watch the Hokies and North Carolina State battle on April 16.

Stolle had a pair of home runs in Tech's win over Radford at Salem, and then hit a walk-off solo blast to lift the Hokies over Winthrop in the regular season finale.

These moments are just a few of the many accomplished during the Hokies' amazing 2005 season, one that will go down as a benchmark in the program's history.

Thomas is banking on the 2005 NCAA bid not being Tech's last. With an athletic group of position players—as well as one of the best pitchers in the nation—returning, he is hoping that the second bid will come next May.

Thomas is just hoping that next time, the suspense leading up to the bid won't be quite as dramatic.

# TECH SOFTBALL FACILITIES

The Virginia Tech softball team has the luxury of playing and practicing in some of the finest facilities on the east coast. Using the Tech Softball Field, Rector Field House and the Jim "Bulldog" Haren weight room, the Hokies train with the best in preparing to win championships.

The Tech Softball Field is a great complex that just keeps getting better. A new backstop and padding was installed in 2001 to give fans more protection when enjoying a game.

This past summer, the old field was torn up and replaced, complete with a modern drainage system and grass apron around the entire field. Tech also has one of the best field crews around.

The dugouts, faced with Hokie stone, are complete with bathrooms, water fountains and equipment rooms. They are ADA accessible and have access to separate bullpens.

The field, which was completed in the fall of 1997, has dimensions of 200 feet down the lines and 220 feet to center field.

Over the past six seasons at home, the Hokies have compiled a record of 105-32 (.766), including a 17-0 campaign in 1999, a 20-3 record in 2000, 18-4 in 2001 and a 16-3 season in 2002, 10-7 in 2003 and 15-6 in 2004.

In 1999, permanent bench-back seats were added. With the new bleachers, the complex can

easily hold up to 500 fans and a record 1,977 fans crammed in and around the park for a doubleheader against North Carolina State. Trees now line the outfield fence, providing fans shade to watch the game from beyond the fence on sunny days.

At the top of the bleachers is a prefabricated, 8-by-18 foot press box. Complete with power and phone lines, it accommodates all the needs of the media.

The press box also has air conditioning and heat, as well as Ethernet cable, which allows for live stats of every home game on Tech's official Web site, [hokiesports.com](http://hokiesports.com).

On top of the press box is a camera platform, allowing for video by either team, as well as media covering the event.

A state-of-the-art scoreboard was installed during the 1998 season, making it easier for coaches, players and fans to keep up with the game.

When weather doesn't allow for outdoor practice, the team moves into Rector Field House. Located adjacent to the playing field, the field house has an artificial surface, batting cages and ample room for drills. It is also equipped with a training room.

In 2004, thanks to a generous donation, a new batting cage was installed behind the Virginia Tech dugout, giving the Hokies another great tool in helping them achieve their goals.

This year, permanent restroom facilities will be available for use. On-site dressing rooms, permanent concession stands and seating expansion, as well as lights are all possible future projects.

# ATHLETIC TRAINING

The Virginia Tech Sports Medicine Department is an ever-changing and developing unit that strives to provide the most current and

comprehensive care to all student-athletes. The department is constantly evolving to incorporate new ideas and state-of-the-art resources for the betterment of student-athletes.

A professional staff — including primary care physicians who are Board certified in family medicine and sports medicine, orthopaedic surgeons, certified athletic trainers, physical therapists, chiropractors, massage therapists, sport psychologists, nutritionists and orthotists — is available to manage the health care of Tech athletes.

As part of the evolution, Tech recently completed its fourth full year in the 4,300-square-foot Eddie Ferrell Memorial Training Room. This area consolidated the training rooms that existed in the Merryman Center and Cassell Coliseum. The facility gives the training staff a centralized area to care for the needs of all Virginia Tech student-athletes.

There is top-of-the-line equipment and a unique style of architecture, developed by Glenn Reynolds, AIA and Larry Perry as the consulting engineer.

The Ferrell Training Room, which nearly doubles the size of the former Merryman Center facility, also allows the staff to utilize that room for physical therapy, chiropractic care and massage therapy. With its completion, Virginia Tech now has more than 10,000 square feet dedicated to sports medicine, placing Tech in the top five percent nationally.

In addition, the \$10 million Merryman Center, a state-of-the-art facility that includes 2,400 square feet of medical space, supplements the new training room. This treatment room has numerous treatment modalities, including portable X-ray, electric stimulation, ultrasound, hot and cold packs and a lumbar/cervical traction unit. It also has offices for the staff, dozens of training tables, two cold tubs, whirlpools, an underwater treadmill, a Biodex System 3 and various other pieces of rehabilitation equipment.

A vital part of student-athletes services is the access to the Schiffert Student Health Center in McComas Hall. A health center and counseling services are available on one side of McComas Hall, while recreation

sports and fitness programs are available on the other. The center also has a fully operational diagnostic laboratory, X-ray facilities and eight full-time physicians.

The range of benefits athletes have access to include custom orthotics, custom mouth guards, specialized DonJoy prophylactic bracing and many other options to help prevent or protect them from injuries.

If physical therapy is needed, student-athletes can be seen by therapist Mark Piechoski in the Ferrell Training Room. Piechoski, who is a certified athletic trainer, physical therapist, and strength and conditioning specialist plays a large role in the overall program developed to return the injured athlete back to 100 percent. Virginia Tech also has the services of Dr. Greg Tilley, team

chiropractor. Tilley provides Tech athletes with specialized treatment for spine-related conditions and also plays a huge role in performance enhancement through various chiropractic techniques.

Team orthopaedic surgeons Dr. Marc Siegel and Dr. Scott Urch bring a wealth of experience and skills to assist when athletes need orthopaedic surgery to repair certain types of sports-related injuries that occur from time to time. Tech also maintains a special relationship with Montgomery Regional Hospital. Montgomery Regional Hospital is the choice for state-of-the-art equipment to perform surgeries, diagnostic imaging and processing of laboratory requests.

# ACADEMIC SUPPORT

The success of Virginia Tech's softball program rests largely on the academic progress of each student-athlete. The academic performance of Tech student-athletes has improved each year due in part to the Student Athlete Academic Support Services (SAASS).

The Virginia Tech graduation rate for student-athletes has risen significantly in recent years and is a school-best 74 percent for 2005. This marks the third time in the last four years that Virginia Tech's student-athlete graduation rate has been 70 percent or better.

Tech's softball team has consistently had one of the highest team GPAs in the athletic department. In 2000, the team had the ninth-highest team GPA in college softball and has had three players named Academic All-Americans.

In addition to posting impressive graduation figures, Virginia Tech's student-athletes continue to excel in the classroom. For the 2004 calendar year, 425 3.0 GPA's were earned by student-athletes, student trainers,

student managers, cheerleaders and HighTechs.

Student-athletes are the most visible student component of a university. They entertain thousands of fans, students and alumni.

Due to their time commitment and their high visibility, it is an obligation and in the best interest of the university to supply these students with services which will allow them to maximize their academic potential.

The Virginia Tech Student Athlete Academic Support Services office is committed to providing fundamental and supplemental programming, consistent with University and NCAA policy, aimed at enhancing

each student-athlete's educational experience.

Stakeholders of the office's mission include student-athletes and their families, the university community, coaches and athletics administrators.

SAASS seeks to develop relationships with its stakeholders that are founded on trust and respect, and provides the following services to accommodate their needs:

- University and NCAA information
- Orientation
- Academic assessment
- The development of an effective student life program
- Appropriate referrals
- Monitored study environments
- Tutorial programs
- State of the art technological learning assistance
- Student Athlete academic performance evaluations

The expectations of the Virginia Tech community are that each student-athlete achieves

their maximum academic and athletic potential. With the proper assistance, facilities and encouragement, these potentials can become a reality.

SAASS provides programming for student-athletes from their freshman year through graduation. This includes a comprehensive orientation to Tech, study hall, mentoring, tutoring, academic monitoring, academic recognition and eligibility education.

In the 2005-06 academic year, the SAASS office will be moving to a new area in the West Side of Lane Stadium.

Here, student-athletes will have access to state-of-the-art technology, quiet study facilities, individualized tutorial rooms, and direct access to the SAASS staff.

Athletes can use these facilities between classes, after practice or in the evenings, with flexible hours tailored to make the most of a student-athlete's limited time.

# STUDENT LIFE

The Virginia Tech Athletics Office of Student Life is committed to

developing the total student-athlete. Director Megan Armbruster is dedicated to enhancing the quality of the student-athlete experience

through programs the office administers. The programming implemented by the Virginia Tech Athletics Office of Student Life is modeled after the NCAA/CHAMPS Life Skills Program. The five components are Personal Development, Career Development, Academic Excellence, Athletic Excellence and Community Outreach.

## Personal Development

Virginia Tech student-athletes obtain personal development education through workshops and mandatory speakers. Presentation topics include gambling, alcohol

abuse, sexual violence and healthy relationships, media relations, and manners and etiquette dinners.

## Career Development

In close collaboration with the Virginia Tech Career Services Center, career development programs are designed specifically for student-athletes. Resumé design, career fair etiquette, mock interviews, interview attire and mini-career fairs are just a few examples of workshops hosted by the Athletics Office of Student Life. Student-athletes are encouraged to participate in on-campus interviewing and eRecruiting along with securing internships and co-ops during their college careers. In 2005, both Cintas Corporation and NVR Inc., hosted workshops providing student-athletes the opportunity to hear job search strategies directly from employers.

## Academic Excellence

The Virginia Tech Athletics Office of Student Life is responsible for nominating student-athletes for academic honors and awards. Athletes are nominated for on-campus, Atlantic Coast Conference

and national awards. Student-athletes with a 3.0 GPA are rewarded each semester by being honored on the Athletic Director's Honor Roll. The 2004 calendar year listed 315 student-athletes with this honor. Bob Ritchie, men's basketball, and Mallory Soldner, women's soccer, received the Skelton Award for Academic Excellence in Athletics. The award is given to one male and one female student-athlete who demonstrate leadership, outstanding academic excellence and community involvement. The recipients of the award receive a \$5,000 scholarship donated by Dr. Bill and Peggy Skelton.

## Athletic Excellence

The Virginia Tech Student Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC) promotes effective communication between athletic administration and student-athletes. SAAC is comprised of two representatives from each sport. These representatives meet twice a month to discuss issues and concerns regarding their sport, department of athletics, ACC and NCAA legislation. The student-athletes encourage their teammates to get involved both on campus and

in the community. Each year SAAC sponsors a canned food drive during the basketball season.

## Community Outreach

The Athletics Office of Student Life community outreach program is "Hokies with Heart." Student-athletes are encouraged to volunteer throughout their college experience. In collaboration with the Virginia Tech Corp of Cadets and student leadership, the "Hokies with Heart" program works together with the Montgomery County Public Schools System to visit with local school kids about the importance of education and character development. In 2004, the student-athletes also volunteered with the Montgomery County Christmas Store, Virginia Tech White Ribbon Campaign and Hokies United Tsunami Relief Campaign.

Each athletic team at Virginia Tech is encouraged to select one local charity on which to focus their philanthropic efforts throughout the year. The softball team works with the local Big Brothers/Big Sisters Organization.

# ATHLETIC PERFORMANCE

One of the most important aspects of a successful college softball program is its strength and conditioning program. Before the lights ever come on, before the first pitch is thrown and before the first game and is played, college softball players work on getting themselves physically prepared for the rigors of a four-month season.

Thanks to the direction of Assistant Athletics Director for Athletic Performance Mike Gentry, the Virginia Tech strength and conditioning program is among the best in the nation, helping to make the softball

program one of the best as well.

One of the main support centers of Tech softball is the strength and conditioning program.

The softball team trains in the Jim "Bulldog" Haren Weight Room. Located in Jamerson Athletic Center, the 5,000-square foot weight room was officially dedicated in September 1985 to Haren, a former Hokie player and long-time supporter of the Virginia Tech Athletics Department.

Gentry is in his 19th season as the Hokies' director of strength and conditioning. As assistant athletics director for athletic performance, his duties include overseeing the

strength and conditioning training of athletes in all 21 varsity sports at Virginia Tech.

In May 2003, Gentry was honored by the Collegiate Strength and Conditioning Coaches when he was named a Master Strength and Conditioning Coach.

Gentry is currently one of only 36 coaches in the country to have received the CSCC's highest award.

In 1995 and 1996, Gentry was recognized by the National Strength and Conditioning Association as a finalist for the National Strength and Conditioning Professional of the Year.

Assisting Gentry in the weight room this year are full-time assistant strength and conditioning coaches: Jay Johnson, director of strength and conditioning and Terry Mitchell, assistant director of strength and conditioning, and Jamie Meyer, a former Tech volleyball player.

Former Tech football players Cols Colas and Mike Jackson are graduate assistants for strength and conditioning.

Mitchell, who handles the strength and conditioning for Tech's softball team, has experience in the Texas Rangers farm system.

He graduated from Lee (Tenn.) College in 1994 and earned a master's in health promotions from Tech in 2004. Mitchell is married to the former Terri Thompson and this is his fifth year with the Tech softball program.

## Sports Nutrition

Eating healthy and choosing nutritious diets are important aspects of a Virginia Tech student-athlete's life, and that's why in July 2002, the athletics department implemented the sports nutrition program. Amy Freel serves as the director.

Freel, who is in her fourth year as the sports nutritionist in the Virginia Tech Athletics Department, works individually with student-

athletes to provide them with information they need on their diet. She also provides individual players with diet counseling on issues such as gaining lean muscle mass, losing body fat, and eating choices to improve performance.

She also designs preseason menus, snacks and training table menus for the football team.

The sports nutritionist works with the "Training Edge," a dining option for health-conscious students and athletes, to design menus for training tables and daily menu selections.

Also in July 2002, the Virginia Tech Athletics Department purchased the BOD POD body composition system. Tech is one of a handful of college athletic departments

using this type of technology. The BOD POD is found in many professional training facilities, such as the NFL and Major League Baseball. It accurately measures body composition (percent of body fat, lean muscle mass and fat mass) through air displacement within five minutes. Research has shown that an increase in lean muscle mass will increase athletic performance. The Sports Nutrition Program has helped countless Tech athletes maximize their athletic performance.

Freel received her undergraduate degree in dietetics in 1996 from Ball State University.

She became a registered dietitian in 1997 and earned her master's degree in dietetics from Ball State in 1998.

## Sport Psychology

Virginia Tech also offers another important service to all its student-athletes — sport psychology.

Dr. Gary Bennett coordinates the sport psychology department, which offers psychological and performance enhancement services for student-athletes.

Bennett, who is in his sixth year as the sport psychologist for the Virginia Tech Athletics Department, also works closely with

the Cook Counseling Center.

Bennett meets with student-athletes on an individual basis for personal counseling and to discuss the mental aspects of the game. He also works on team building, communication and performance enhancement.

The sport psychology department also offers an injury group to afford injured athletes the opportunity to meet with other injured athletes and talk about their recovery process.

Injured athletes may also meet individually with the sport psychologists if they do not feel comfortable in the group or cannot make the sessions.

A new addition to the sport psychology resources is the Dynavision 2000, a unique conditioning and training program designed to increase focus and concentration, improve coordination and visuomotor reactions, and increase peripheral awareness.




