Hokies Head To Salem For Postseason Conference Tournament

2002 Virginia Tech Softball Overall: 40-16 BIG EAST: 12-8

The Virginia Tech softball team will make its first appearance in the BIG EAST Softball Championship after winning its last six conference games to claim one of the four spots in the double-elimination tournament.

Following a split with Pitt on April 21st, the Hokies reeled off sweeps of St. John's, Boston College and Seton Hall to finish 12-8 in the conference. Tech will enter the tournament seeded fourth, and will face top-seeded Notre Dame at 1:30 p.m., on Thursday in the first round.

Notre Dame is the top seed in the tournament after going 18-2 in conference play. Villanova (16-4) is seeded second with Syracuse (12-6) seeded third and the Hokies fourth. Tech is 0-6 combined against those teams this season.

Dobbe's The One

Senior Ashlee Dobbe was the workhorse down the stretch for the Hokies, pitching the final six games and coming up with six victories. Of a possible 46 innings in those six games, she threw 43.0 of them,

going 6-0. She had an ERA of 0.98 in that span, striking out 39 while throwing three shut outs.

Record-breaking Season

The 2002 version of the Hokie softball team has been breaking records left and right this year (see page 2). The team has already broken the school mark for home runs in a season with 38 and has tied the mark for doubles in a season with 93.

Carmen Farmer has scored the most runs of anyone in the program's history (47) and Ashlee Dobbe has thrown 256.0 innings, also a new mark.

Several other records, both individual and team, are in jeopardy and could fall this weekend.

The Season Thus Far

The Virginia Tech softball team enters the BIG EAST Softball Championship with a record of 40-16 overall, 12-8 in the conference.

The season started with a tough 7-6 loss to Miami of Ohio at the Triangle

Classic in Raleigh. The Hokies bounced back to beat Elon and later avenged the loss to the Redhawks, winning 10-2 in five innings. The Hokies finally got on a winning streak, sweeping Winthrop and Charlotte before beating Middle Tennessee State at the Frost Classic.

After dropping a 5-0 decision to Arkansas, the rest of the Frost Classic was rained out and the Hokies headed to Plant City, Fla., for the Speedline Invitational. After alternating wins and losses on the first three days, the Hokies came alive on the final day to beat Hofstra and Georgia State to claim the consolation bracket title.

Those two wins started a string of 13 victories, the second-longest in the program's seven-year history. Wins over Stony Brook, Akron and Canisius in the Hokie Classic, followed by a sweep of Providence to open BIG EAST play, put the Hokies at 16-7 overall.

Tech wasn't done, though, continuing its winning ways. The Hokies swept Liberty, then put up two wins against both Radford and Gardner-Webb in the Easter Round-Robin Classic at Blacksburg.

The streak came to an end on April 3 at Salem when the Hokies dropped a tough 3-2 decision to Virginia. Tech came back to win the second game of the doubleheader, 2-1 in eight innings.

After a sweep at Connecticut, the Hokies hit some bumps in the road. After being swept at Syracuse, Tech came back to sweep James Madison before splitting with Rutgers and being swept by Villanova at home.

Ashlee Dobbe got Tech back on the right track on April 17, throwing a nohitter against Tennessee at Bristol, Tenn., in the annual State Line Classic. The good feelings ended quickly as Tech was swept at Notre Dame then split at Pittsburgh to put Tech at 6-8 in the conference and fighting for its life.

With 10 games remaining, the Hokies got it together and won each of the last 10, including the last six in conference play to make the tournament. Each of the last four

games was decided by one run.

On May 5, Tech knew it needed two wins over Seton Hall to get in. After falling 2-0, the Hokies clawed back to tie it up at two before Mindi Wylie drove in Carmen Farmer with a double in the ninth inning to give the Hokies a 3-2 win. The second game also went extra innings as Megan Evans' solo homer in the ninth gave Tech a 1-0 win.

899 and Counting

Ashlee Dobbe will go down as the greatest pitcher in Tech softball history. She is sitting at 899 career strikeouts, which is a school record. Entering this season, only 21 pitchers in NCAA history have recorded 900 or more strikeouts.

Dobbe holds over a dozen school pitching marks including wins, saves, innings pitched, strikeouts and appearances. She was the Atlantic 10 Rookie of the Year in 1999 and has been selected to the all-state team three times. This year, she has been named the BIG EAST Pitcher of the Week three times.

Looking For a Bid

At 40-16, the Hokies have a great shot of getting a bid to the NCAA Championships, which run May 16-19 at eight regional sites.

Forty-eight teams are selected for championship play. Six teams will participate at each of eight regional sites. The Women's College World Series will include the eight regional winners and will be held May 23-27 at Oklahoma City.

The winner of this weekend's BIG EAST Tournament receives an automatic bid, but two at-large bids came from the BIG EAST last season.

The Teams

Notre Dame Fighting Irish

Notre Dame will be the top seed in the tournament for the seventh consecutive year after going 18-2 in conference play. The Irish only lost to Syracuse and Rutgers in BIG EAST play. Overall, Notre Dame is 38-14 and has several wins over nationally-ranked opponents, including No. 3 Nebraska and No. 18 DePaul.

The Irish swept the Hokies at South Bend this year, winning the first game 8-0 in five innings before taking the second game 10-0 in five innings.

Villanova Wildcats

Villanova will be the second seed in the tournament after posting a 14-6 BIG EAST mark. The 'Cats were swept by Notre Dame and Pittsburgh, and dropped

Virginia Tech Hokies

Virginia Tech is the No. 4 seed and is 40-16 overall, 12-8 in the conference. Tech lost to each of the other three teams in the tournament, but comes in hot, winners of its last 10.

SCOT THOMAS

Head Coach · Seventh Season · 243-172

East Tennessee State • 1991

Now in his seventh season, Coach Scot Thomas has positioned Hokie softball as one of the most respected programs not only in the conference and region, but on the national map as well. With five consecutive winning seasons under his belt, Thomas has the Hokies consistently challenging for conference titles and honors.

Thomas became Tech's first head softball coach when he was hired on July 7, 1995. In that time, he has recorded over 200 wins and made the postseason conference tournament three times. Last year, he took the Hokies into a tough new conference and directed the team to a finish in the top five. The team finished with a 36-23 overall record and a mark of 12-8 in the BIG EAST Conference.

In his first season, he led a team of non-scholarship athletes to a respectable 16-32 record, a total not indicative of the progress made in just one season. An all-conference player, a two-hit shutout and an eight-game winning streak were just some of the highlights of the 1996 season.

In 1997, Thomas' squad batted nearly .300 for the season, placed two players on the Atlantic 10 All-Conference first-team and won eight more games than during the inaugural season. In its second season, Thomas led the softball team to a 24-32 record and a fifth-place finish in the conference, just two games shy of the four-team league tournament.

The 1998 season proved to be one of the most decorated in Tech's budding history. With an extremely young squad the Hokies posted the first winning season ever, with a 32-31 record, a second-place finish in the Atlantic 10, two players on the A-10 All-Conference team and two GTE Academic All-Americans.

The 1999 season is one that will stand out in Tech history forever. The Hokies finished a spectacular regular season ranked 25th in the nation with a 54-16 record. In just its fourth year as a varsity sport, the team placed second at the A-10 tournament, falling to UMass for the

second year in a row. The Hokies' hopes for a regional at-large bid were denied, but they did receive the national attention they had been working for. An upset of No. 4

Michigan highlighted the season. Tech finished the year undefeated at home and 14-2 in A-10 play, losing only to UMass. The Hokies had the third-longest winning streak in the nation at 26, and at one point won 35 of 36 games.

In 2000, his first recruiting class left its mark on the program as the Hokies went 41-22 and finished second in the Atlantic 10 Tournament. All-Conference, A-10 Player of the Year, All-Tournament, GTE District III Academic All-American, Virginia State Co-Player of the Year and two-time GTE National First-Team Academic All-American Michelle Meadows led the team both on the field and off.

This year, he has led the Hokies to their third 40-win season in

just seven seasons as a varsity program and a berth in the BIG EAST Softball Championships. The Hokies had winning streaks of 13 and 10 games and have set numerous individual and team records, including home runs and runs driven in.

Thomas graduated from East Tennessee State University in 1991 with a bachelor's in physical education. He is on the Louisville Slugger advisory staff for the fifth straight year.

A native of Blacksburg, Va., Thomas graduated from Blacksburg High where he was a member of the football and baseball teams.

Thomas is married to the former Carolyn Croy, a Tech graduate from Blacksburg. She is employed as a third-grade teacher at Gilbert Linkous Elementary school. The couple has a son, Andrew Scot, who is 4, and a daughter, Eliza Leigh, who was born November 16, 2001.





MONICA TRINER

Assistant Coach • Second Season South Florida • 1999

Former collegiate All-American and current professional standout Monica Triner is in her second year as the Hokies' assistant coach. Her responsibilities include working with the pitchers, as well as recruiting, conditioning and arranging all travel plans.

In her first season as pitching coach, her staff posted a team ERA of 1.23, second-best in the BIG EAST Conference and 18th in the country. The starting three of Ashlee Dobbe, Catherine Gilliam and Clarisa Crowell each had an ERA of 1.26 or less and they all posted nine wins or more.

This year, she has helped Dobbe set or break nearly every pitching record at Tech, including wins, saves and strikeouts. Dobbe enters the BIG EAST Softball Championship with 28 wins, among the tops in the nation.

Triner came to Tech after serving as a volunteer assistant coach

at her alma mater, South Florida. She was the second overall pick in the 1999 Women's Professional Softball League draft and led the Tampa Bay FireStix to the title as a rookie.

Triner played her college softball at the University of South Florida, where she held 21 softball records and posted a career record of 92-33 with a school-record 37 shutouts. She had an 0.95 ERA and holds records for career wins, complete games (109), innings pitched (786) and strikeouts (641).

Triner batted .390 at USF with a school-record 23 home runs and 158 RBI. She was a two-time All-American and three-time All-Southeast Region selection. Triner graduated from USF in 1999 with a B.S. in criminology.

A native of Gibsonton, Fla., Triner graduated from East Bay High in 1995. At East Bay, she hit over .400 each of her four seasons and had an ERA of 0.09 her senior year.



AL BRAUNS Assistant Coach • Fourth Season

Penn State • 1973

Al Brauns is in his fourth year as an assistant for the Hokies. His responsibilities include working with the outfielders, field maintenance, equipment and recruiting.

Brauns is a familiar face in Hokie sports, holding a position with the athletic department for three years prior to joining the softball staff.

Under his direction, numerous players have earned all-state, allconference and all-region honors. Bronwyn Blair, a four-year starter in centerfield, was drafted by the Tampa Bay FireStix of the WPSL last summer.

This year, he had the challenge of rebuilding the outfield as only Tiffany Hurt returned having any significant playing time. The trio of Hurt, Kathleen Jones and Sarah Prosise have made steady improvement throughout the season, both in the field and at the plate. All three have a fielding percentage of .900 or better and Prosise has six assists from her right field position.

Brauns started playing fastpitch in the 1960s and finished his career playing with a men's major team from 1970-74.

Brauns is originally from Uniontown, Pa., and graduated from Penn State in 1973 with a degree in criminology.

Coach Brauns and his wife, Michelle, have one child, Adam, who is 9 years old.

Brauns also has two other sons, Eric, 33, and Jason, 27. He has two grandchildren, Alaina and Allison.


