- Separate Virginia Tech swimming & diving team entrance, parking area and locker rooms
- Spectator seating for competitive swimming and diving events including second-level seating was recently added, allowing the facility to be capable of hosting Atlantic Coast Conference championships and other national-caliber meets
- A therapy pool for physical therapy, injuries, arthritic persons and rehabilitation
- A family/leisure pool with a two-story slide, water walking lanes, zero depth entrance, water jets and other recreational features
- Recently, funding was approved for full diving amenities, including 5-, 7.5- and 10-meter platforms



War Memorial Pool



War Memorial Pool, located just off the campus Drillfield in War Memorial Gym, is Virginia Tech's swimming and diving facility. The complex includes a 25-yard pool with eight lanes and a diving well. The movable bulkhead which separates the pool from the diving well can be adjusted to lengthen the pool to 25 meters.

Complete with underwater windows and sound system, the facility also is equipped with the Colorado Electronic Timing System and scoreboard. Seven years ago, a 12-line readout scoreboard was installed for swimming, as well as a three-line scoreboard for diving.

Two years ago, the team moved into state of the art locker rooms with a team lounge adjacent. The program also enjoys a team room, located just off the men's locker room.

The diving well is made up of two 1-meter boards, a 3-meter board and a 5-meter platform. The diving team also utilizes a hot tub and trampoline located on the pool deck. The diving well can be fully converted to a six-lane, 20-yard backstroke sprint tank, complete with lane lines, flags and starting blocks.

The pool has served as the site for two Virginia state championship meets and one Metro conference championship.

War Memorial Gym itself houses numerous other facilities including saunas, weight rooms, racquetball courts and six basketball courts. The Hokies also have the use of other equipment such as power-racks for strength swimming and VASA trainers, VASA climbers and bicycles for dry land.



Located in War Memorial Hall, Virginia Tech's swimming pool and diving area provide an outstanding venue for competition.





Men's Outlook

The H₂Okie men and head coach Ned Skinner return for their third season in the Atlantic Coast Conference hoping to build upon the previous two seasons of success. An experienced crew returns, including 13 letterwinners with three All-Americans among them. A talented group of freshmen hope to impact the team, while being anchored by the Hokies returners.

SPRINT

This season, the sprint crew will be anchored by a crop of juniors. Pete Cancila, Zac Czaplicki, and Jake Bova, coupled with

transfer Kaan Tayla, will lead the charge in arguably the best sprint crew in Tech's history. Cancila placed seventh and tenth in the 50- and 100-yard freestyle events, respectively, at the conference meet last season. Czaplicki was the runner-up in the 200-yard freestyle and seventh in the 100-yard freestyle at the same meet, while Bova's improvement over the summer will be a factor in relays. Tayla represented his native country of Turkey in the 2004 Olympics in Athens, Greece in the 50- and 100-meter sprint events. Sophomore Ian deToll will also add strength to this impressive crew.

Newcomer Jared Stowers, who helped his high school earn a state championship, looks to add depth to the strong contingent. Scott Beard will be called upon to compete in the relay events.

FREESTYLE

Co-captains Gus Calado and Neil Savage will be expected to help the H₂Okies in numerous freestyle events, along with Czaplicki. Calado finished fifth at the ACC championships last season in the 500-yard freestyle, while Savage has scored numerous points for the Hokies in the freestyle events. Czaplicki finished eighth in the 500-yard freestyle at the league meet.



Freshmen Griffin Lutterbein, Scott Harkins, Andrew Rogers and Chip Hughes will also show their freestyle range. John Riley and Ben Miller will look to capitalize on strong freshman campaigns this season.


INDIVIDUAL MEDLEY

Beard and Calado will be the foundation of the individual medley events, while James Aitken, Stephen Jensen and Savage will be key point scorers. Beard won the 200-yard individual medley at UNC Wilmington last season, while Calado finished third at the ACCs in the 400-yard individual medley event.

BACKSTROKE

Beard, Cancila and Calado are key returners for Tech in this area. Beard placed in the Top 3 in the 100-yard backstroke event, earning All-ACC honors.

Kevin Koehr, Jimmy McLaughlin and Rogers look to build on the historically strong backstroke group. Ben Prue, who finished 16th in the 200-yard backstroke and 21st in the 100-yard backstroke at the ACC meet, will add depth in these events.

BUTTERFLY

Returning ACC champions Beard (100-yard butterfly) and Calado (200-yard butterfly) will set the tone for arguably the strongest event in the program. Beard, the first male $\rm H_2Okie$ to earn an individual ACC crown, set the ACC meet record in the 100-yard butterfly. Calado earned All-American honors in the 200-yard butterfly event, finishing fourth at the national championships.

Cancila, Ian deToll, Mike Lewis and McLaughlin will add strength in this event.

BREASTSTROKE

Veterans Andy Pelenberg and Aitken will be heavy factors in the breaststroke events and breaststroke legs of relays. Pelenberg finished 25th in the 200-yard breaststroke at the ACC championships, while Aitken was 18th in the 100yard breaststroke.

Jonathan Huss, Harkins and transfer Mathew Nicolino also will be relied upon by Tech in the breaststroke events.

DIVING

ACC finalist Chris Waldheim anchors the young diving crew featuring Mikey McDonald who has excellent credentials. Waldheim was 16th on the 1-meter board and 23rd on the 3-meter at the conference championships. McDonald brings in two Junior National championships and nine Indoor National championships. Pat Graves also will be called upon on the boards. Graves finished 14th at the Virginia high school state championships as a senior.

Women's Outlook

The Tech women return 12 letterwinners from the 2005-06 season's Top 5 finish in the Atlantic Coast conference. Head coach Ned Skinner and the team plan to rely on their experienced returners for leadership, while also expecting the newcomers to step up and make an impact.

SPRINT

Sara Smith, Courtney Walsh, Allison Luttermoser and Jordan McHorney will anchor the sprint crew. Smith was the runner-up in the 100-yard freestyle event at the ACC championships last season. Walsh finished the 100-yard freestyle at the same meet with a 14th-place finish, while also taking 19th and 20th in the 50- and 200-yard freestyle events, respectively. Luttermoser scored numerous points for the $\rm H_2Okies$ in the sprint events last season, as did McHorney.

Freshmen Sarah Ameen, Katie Suhr and Julie Sablik will assist in this historically strong area for Tech.

FREESTYLE

Smith, Luttermoser, Beth Byrum, Stephanie Jones, Millie Campbell, Sara Shapiro, Kelly deMarrais, Lauren Dillon and Megan Newell will be key freestyleers in multiple distances.

Byrum finished the 1,650-yard freestyle ninth at the ACC championships, while also recording a 14th spot in the 500-yard event. Jones finished 14th in the mile at the conference meet, while scoring points for the H₂0kies throughout the dual-meet season.

INDIVIDUAL MEDLEY

Smith and Jessica Botzum return as ACC finalists, along with Luttermoser, Claire Dickey and Campbell. Smith earned an ACC individual title in the 200-yard individual medley last season. Luttermoser was 11th in the same event at the conference meet. Dickey took 16th in the 200-yard

individual medley at the ACCs. Campbell finished the 200-yard individual medley in eighth at the league championships.

Newcomers Abby Barney and Katie Suhr look to add even more strength in the individual medley events.

BACKSTROKE

Returners Luttermoser, Dickey and McHorney will be the foundation of this stroke, while a strong crop of freshmen in Suhr, Shapiro and deMarrais will all be in the mix. Luttermoser was 11th in the 200-yard backstroke at ACCs, Dickey finished in the Top 20 in both the 100- and 200-yard backstroke, and McHorney was 13th in the 100-yard backstroke.

Suhr earned a state championship in the 100yard backstroke. Shapiro was the runner-up at states in the 100-yard backstroke as a senior.

BUTTERFLY

Upperclassmen Becky Horning, Newell, Smith and Botzum will be called upon while newcomers Suhr, Sablik and Barney will all see action. Horning finished in the Top 25 at the ACC championships in both the 100- and 200-yard butterfly, while Newell was 16th in the 200-yard butterfly.

Sablik is a three-time state champion in the 100-yard butterfly, while Barney is a three-time All-American in the same event.

BREASTSTROKE

Returning All-American Botzum once again anchors a strong group. Botzum was ninth in the 200-yard breaststroke at the NCAA championships, earning honorable mention All-America status last season, she had previously garnered All-American honors in the same event. Campbell should continue on her success in the breaststroke events. She was sixth and ninth in the 100- and 200-yard breaststroke events, respectively, at the conference championships.

Elder took 15th at the Speedo Junior National Championships on the 1-meter board, while she won the AAA State Diving championships her junior year. Fulton is a four-time state qualifier, finishing third at the finals as a senior. Julia Bradford, Michele White and Blaire Buergler also look to impact the team on the boards.

Coach Ned Skinner



Ned Skinner, who led the Hokies to a top 30 finish at the NCAA men's championships last season, opens his ninth year at the helm of the Virginia Tech men's and women's swimming and diving teams with a talented team that has improved by leaps and

bounds in their first two seasons in the ACC.

In 2006, his teams continued their assault on the ACC, with the women garnering a fourth-place finish at the conference championships, while the men placed sixth. He has coached Tech's only two first-team All-Americans in Jessica Botzum (2005) and Gus Calado (2006). He has also coached multiple honorable mention All-Americans over the past three seasons.

Skinner also has coached a handful of ACC individual champions in the schools' first two seasons in the conference. This includes Sara Smith, Gus Calado and Scott Beard, who all captured conference titles last February in College Park, Md. Mason Walsh also captured a title in the Hokies first season in the league.

In his first season in the ACC, Skinner led the women's and men's teams to fifth and seventh place finishes, respectively. Botzum scored a fifth-place finish in that year's NCAA championships to become Tech's first true All-American.

In 2001, his first year in the BIG EAST, Skinner led the women to a second-place finish, while the men placed third. In 2003, the men placed second in the conference and the women fourth. Skinner was named the BIG EAST Men's Coach of the Year while Kevin Furlong was named the Outstanding Men's Swimmer. In 2004, both Tech squads finished third at the BIG EAST championships. Skinner was named Co-Coach of the Year for the men, while Calado was named the men's Most Outstanding Swimmer.

In his first two years as head coach of the Hokie swimming and diving squads, Skinner was named the Atlantic 10 Women's Coach of the Year twice and led the women's team to two Atlantic 10 championships, while the men won their first conference title in this conference in 2000.

He has also founded and directs the Fighting Gobbler Swim Camp, a one-week swim camp held at Virginia Tech.

Dr. Skinner came to the Hokies after serving four years as the director of competitive swimming at the College of William & Mary. In his last season at W&M, he coached the Tribe women to a second place finish at the ECACs, while the men were fourth of 40 teams. Also, Skinner was named ECAC Coach of the Year. The women's team finished in the top 12 at the ECAC event during each of Skinner's four seasons.

The W&M men's team posted a fourth-place showing at the '98 ECAC championships and finished seventh in 1997. During Skinner's tenure, both the men's and women's squads were named Academic All-America Teams four straight years.

Skinner also coached Kristen Schnittger to four consecutive ECAC titles in the 100 breaststroke at the College of William & Mary.

Before his stint at William & Mary, Skinner was the head coach and aquatics director at Central Connecticut State University for four seasons.

A 1989 graduate of Louisiana State University, Skinner was captain of the 1988 squad that captured the SEC championship. He graduated from LSU with a bachelor of arts in advertising and a split minor in marketing and economics.

Skinner earned his master of science in athletic administration at Ohio University while serving the swim team as a graduate assistant. While at Ohio, he helped coach the women's team to the 1990 MAC championship.

On the non-collegiate level, Skinner founded, directed and coached the Central Connecticut Aquatics team, a 75-member team of children from ages 7 to 17. He also served as the head swim coach for the Kingsmill Swim Team in Williamsburg.

Skinner is married to the former Allison Cox, who is an attorney for the honorable David Faber in Bluefield, W.Va. They have a two-year old daughter, Samantha. A native of Worthington, Ohio, Skinner received his doctorate in education curriculum and instruction from Virginia Tech in May of 2004.



RON PIEMONTE

Head Diving Coach



Ron Piemonte brings to Virginia Tech over 30 years of diving and coaching experience that spans all levels of the sport. His accomplishments as a coach have brought him national and international recognition as one of the top age group coaches in the United States.

In 2005, Piemonte was voted the Most Outstanding Age Group Diving Coach in the United States. Prior to joining Tech, he spent the last four and a half years at Moss Farms Diving, where he produced six different East National Champions, two YMCA National Champions, three different high school state champions, as well as three different divers representing the U.S. national team in international competitions – one of which was a bronze medalist in the Junior Pan-Am Championships in Belem, Brazil.

He served for ten years at the Tualatin Hills Dive Club in Beaverton, Ore., where Piemonte attained a high level of achievement. There he coached many junior national finalists, senior national qualifiers and finalists, junior and senior national team members, two junior national champions, two different Junior World Championship qualifiers (one bronze medalist) and an Olympic Trials finalist in 2000. Piemonte was chosen as Region 10 Coach of the Year and Zone D Coach of the Year. He is a six-time U.S. National Team coach, and was ranked as one of the top 10 Junior Olympic coaches in the country by the International Olympic Committee of U.S. Diving.

Six more years of coaching (prior to Oregon) were split between Phoenix, Ariz., and Albuquerque, N.M. In Albuquerque, Piemonte was the head coach for men and women at the University of New Mexico, plus ran an age group team of about 20 divers. In Phoenix, he developed a very strong age group program that consistently had both junior and senior national qualifiers.

As a diver, Piemonte competed at the National level from 1974 to 1985. As a scholarship athlete at Arizona State University, he was a Pac-10 champion, runner up and NCAA finalist. One of the highlights of his career was being able to train under one of the Japanese Olympic coaches during his entire senior year of college.

Piemonte has been married for 21 years to wife, Tina, and has three children: Rachele, Leah and Ronnie.

Holloway, a 2001 graduate of North Carolina State University, earned his degree in parks, recreation and tourism management, where he was the

As a member of the NC State swimming and diving team, Holloway made the All-ACC team from 1998-2001, becoming an ACC champion and an ACC record-holder. Announced to the ACC 50th anniversary men's swimming and diving team in 2002, Holloway was a five-time All-American and a two-time Academic All-American. He still holds five school records.

Holloway was ranked internationally in the backstroke events and was also an Olympic Trials qualifier.

Season in Review

The 2005-06 swimming and diving season was a successful one for Virginia Tech head coach Ned Skinner and the H₂Okies. For the second time in as many years both the men's and women's teams placed in the top 36 at the NCAA championships, while two athletes, Gus Calado and Jessica Botzum, both turned in top 10 finishes in individual events.

"The H₂Okies had a great year," Skinner said. "With strong finishes by Gus Calado, Tom Alberi, Zac Czaplicki and Scott Beard at NCAAs, the men's team has taken the step to the next level. The women, with Jessica Botzum and Sara Smith competing at the NCAA level, show that they have promise for next season as well."

The Hokie men enjoyed most of their success at the end of the season. Despite a sixth-place finish at the ACC championships, the Tech men sent a team-record four athletes to the national championships, including an entire relay team for the first time. The 800-yard free relay team

of Alberi, Beard, Calado and Czaplicki placed 15th in the event to score four points.

However, the men's biggest performance came in the 200 butterfly, where Calado set a school record with a time of 1:44.25 to place fourth in the event. The placing was the highest ever by a member of a Virginia Tech swimming and diving team in NCAA competition.

During the season, eight different team records fell on the men's side, including Calado's performance at the NCAA championships. The Tech



junior also set team records in the 500 free, 400 IM and assisted in two record-setting performances in the 800 and 400 free relays. Calado was one of two Hokies to win an individual event at the ACC championships.

Beard, a sophomore, came on strong down the stretch as well. The 6-foot-2 sprinter earned Tech's first individual ACC championship by winning the 100 butterfly with a program-best time of 47.05. He also set a team record in the 100 backstroke at the conference championships.

Fellow sophomore Czaplicki, set a team record at the ACC championships in the 200 free, placing third in the event to become the third all-conference Tech swimmer.

Sophomore Pete Cancila and Alberi also assisted the Hokies' assault on the record books with a fourth-place finish at the conference championship and a team-best time of 2:58.92.

During the regular season, the men had a 5-6 record in dual meets with wins over Georgia Tech, UNC-Wilmington, East Carolina, West Virginia and VMI. Tech fell in its final meet of the year to nationally ranked Pittsburgh, by just seven points.

On the women's side, sophomore Jessica Botzum led the way by earning her second straight top 10 finish at the NCAA championships. In 2006, the sophomore was an honorable

mention All-American with a ninth-place finish in the 200 breaststroke.

Freshman Sara Smith, who enjoyed a dominating ACC championships, qualified for the national meet along with Botzum.

The Hokie women placed fourth at the conference championships, moving up one spot for the second straight year in the league. Smith paced the Hokie women at the meet by capturing an ACC championship in the 200 IM and a second-place finish in the 100 free. While Botzum, junior Mason Walsh, sophomore Talita Ribeiro and senior diver Laura Lunn all earned top five finishes at the meet.

The Tech women broke 11 different school records during the year, led by Smith, who had a hand in six of them. Walsh set a new program best in the 50 free at the ACC championships, while Botzum also added a Tech record in the 100 breaststroke at the same meet.

Lunn, who qualified for the NCAA Zone Diving championship for the second-straight year, set a new program record in three-meter diving with a six-dives score of 297.85. The senior diver earned a fourth-place finish at the ACC championships in the platform competition and a sixth-place scoring in one-meter competition.

Ribeiro enjoyed a program-best showing in the 50 backstroke portion of the 200 medley relay and also helped three other relay teams set school records during the season. While Becky Horning, Emily Guschke, Millie Campbell, Allison Luttermoser and Stephanie Jones all made contributions on the relay teams' record-setting performances.

The Hokie women were dominant during the regular season, showing their depth in nine dual meet victories. Tech's only defeats came to Virginia and North Carolina, two teams which were ranked in the top 15 during most of the season.





Sports Medicine

The Virginia Tech Sports Medicine Department is an ever-changing and developing unit that strives to provide the most current and comprehensive care to all student-athletes. The department is constantly evolving to incorporate new ideas and state-of-the-art resources for the betterment of student-athletes.

A professional staff — including primary care physicians

who are Board certified in family medicine and sports medicine, orthopaedic surgeons, certified athletic trainers, physical therapists, chiropractors, massage therapists, sport psychologists, nutritionists and orthotists — is available to manage the health care of Tech athletes.

As part of the evolution, Tech recently completed its fifth full year in the 4,300-square-foot Eddie Ferrell Memorial Training Room. This area consolidated the training rooms that existed in the Merryman Center and Cassell Coliseum. The facility gives the training staff a centralized area to care for the needs of all Virginia Tech student-athletes.

Virginia Tech now has more than 10,000 square feet dedicated to sports medicine, placing Tech in the top five percent nationally. In addition, the \$10 million Merryman Center,



a state-of-the-art facility that includes 2,400 square feet of medical space, will supplement the new training room. This treatment room has numerous treatment modalities, including portable X-ray, electric stimulation, ultrasound, hot and cold packs and a lumbar/cervical traction unit. It also has offices for the staff, dozens of training tables, two cold tubs, whirlpools, an underwater treadmill, a Biodex System 3 and various other pieces of rehabilitation equipment.

The range of benefits athletes have access to include custom orthotics, custom mouth guards, specialized DonJoy prophylactic bracing and many other options to help prevent or protect them from injuries. The sports medicine staff also takes great pride in treating the athlete year-round.

A vital part of student-athletes services is the access to the Schiffert Student Health Center in McComas Hall. The center also has a fully operational diagnostic laboratory, X-ray facilities and eight full-time physicians.

If physical therapy is needed, student-athletes can be seen by therapist Mark Piechoski in the Ferrell Training Room. Piechoski, who is a certified athletic trainer, physical therapist, and strength and conditioning specialist plays a large role in the overall program developed to return the injured athlete back to 100 percent. In addition, staff sport psychologist Gary Bennett is available to all student-athletes for personal and performance issues. Virginia Tech also has the services of Dr. Greg Tilley, team chiropractor. Tilley provides Tech athletes with specialized treatment for spine-related conditions and also plays a huge role in performance enhancement through various chiropractic techniques.

Team orthopaedic surgeon Dr. Marc Siegel brings a wealth of experience and skills to assist when athletes need orthopaedic surgery to repair certain types of sports-related injuries that occur from time to time.

Tech also maintains a special relationship with Montgomery Regional Hospital. Montgomery Regional Hospital is the choice for state-of-theart equipment to perform surgeries, diagnostic imaging and processing of laboratory requests.

Academic Support

The Virginia Tech graduation rate for studentathletes has risen significantly in recent years and is a school best 74 percent for 2005. This marks the third time in the last four years that Virginia Tech's student athlete graduation rate has been 70 percent or better.

In addition to posting impressive graduation figures, Virginia Tech's student-athletes continue to excel in the classroom. For the 2004 calendar year, 425 3.0 GPA's were earned by student-athletes, student trainers, student managers, cheerleaders and HighTechs. These student athletes and students from support areas were recognized at the Athletic Director's Honors Breakfast last spring.

The Virginia Tech Student Athlete Academic Support Services office is committed to providing fundamental and supplemental programming, consistent with University and NCAA policy, aimed at enhancing each student athlete's educational experience.

Stakeholders of the office's mission include student athletes and their families, the university community, coaches and athletics administrators. SAASS seeks to develop relationships with its stakeholders that are founded on trust and respect, and provides the following services to accommodate their needs:

- University and NCAA information
- Orientation
- Academic assessment
- The development of an effective student life program
- Appropriate referrals
- Monitored study environments
- Tutorial programs
- State of the art technological learning assistance
- Student Athlete academic performance evaluations

SAASS provides programming for studentathletes from their freshman year through graduation. This includes a comprehensive orientation to Tech, study hall, mentoring, tutoring, academic monitoring, academic recognition and eligibility education. Additionally, studentathletes are referred to and encouraged to take advantage of other campus agencies charged with helping students in their academic pursuits.

In the 2006-07 academic year the SAASS office moved to the West Side of Lane Stadium. Student athletes now have access to state-of-the-art technology, quiet study facilities, individualized tutorial rooms, and direct access to the SAASS staff. This complex is a focal point for

the Athletics Department, both aesthetically and pragmatically, and provides a centralized place for student athlete services.

The new facility features more than 18,000 square feet of functional space, 10 staff offices, 18 private tutor rooms, a state-of-the-art classroom, 45 station computer lab, three reading/study rooms, a conference room and a reference library.

Beginning his eighth year at Virginia Tech, Chris Helms is the director and is responsible for the development and leadership of the Student Athlete Academic Support Services office. Helms oversees an office comprised of an associate directors, four assistant directors, two learning specialists, a systems analyst, an intern and a secretary forming a group of professionals serving the needs of all student-athletes.

In addition to his duties directing SAASS, Helms serves as a liaison between the academic and athletic communities and is an ad hoc member of the University Athletic Committee.

Jess Hegr works specifically with the men's and women's swimming and diving teams. She is an assistant directior who is in her second year at Virginia Tech. She also works with baseball, softball, and men's and women's tennis.

Athletic Performance

STRENGTH TRAINING

One of the most important aspects of a succesful college swimming & diving program is its strength and conditioning program.

Thanks to the direction of Assistant Athletics Director for Athletic Performance Mike Gentry, the Virginia Tech strength and conditioning program is among the best in the nation.

One of the main support centers of the Tech swimming & diving team is the strength and conditioning program. The results of hard work by the staff and the student-athletes are beginning to show as the Hokies prepare for their third season in the Atlantic Coast Conference.

Tech swimmers and divers train in the Jim "Bulldog" Haren Weight Room. Located in Jamerson Athletic Center, the 5,000-square foot weight room was officially dedicated in September 1985 to Haren, a former Hokie football player and long-time supporter of the Virginia Tech Athletics Department. The teams also use the state-of-the-art new weight room on the lower level of the Merryman Center. With the two facilities, the Hokies have more than 22,000-square feet of training space.

SPORTS NUTRITION

Eating healthy and choosing nutritious diets are important aspects of a Virginia Tech

student-athlete's life, and that's why in July 2002, the athletics department implemented the sports nutrition program. Amy Freel serves as the director.

Freel works individually with student-athletes to provide them with information they need on their diet. She also provides individual players with diet counseling on issues such as gaining lean muscle mass, losing body fat, and eating choices to improve performance.

She also designs preseason menus, snacks and training table menus for the teams.

"It is extremely beneficial for our studentathletes to have nutrition education and counseling available to them in order for them to remain successful in their sports and outside of athletics," Freel said. "The individualized nutrition education allows me and the athletes to get very specific on their nutritional, personal and sportspecific goals."

The sports nutritionist works with the "Training Edge," a dining option for health-conscious students and athletes, to design menus for training tables and daily menu selections.

SPORT PSYCHOLOGY

Virginia Tech also offers another important service to all its student-athetes – sport psychology. Dr. Gary Bennett coordinates the sport psychology department, which offers psychological and performance enhancement services for studentathletes. Bennett also works closely with the Cook Counseling Center.

Bennett meets with student-athletes on an individual basis for personal counseling and to discuss the mental aspects of the game. He also works on team building, communication and performance enhancement.

Mike Gentry, assistant AD for athletic performance, says, "I've always felt that (sport psychology) was an important element. We want to be a holistic model of an athletics department, and we wanted to and needed to include sport psychology in that model."

"We try to address all the various factors that affect student-athletes' performance on and off the field," Bennett says. "We believe we can help athletes perform better by addressing those concerns."

The sport psychology department also offer an injury group to afford injured athletes the opportunity to meet with other injured athletes and talk about their recovery process. Injured athletes may also meet individually with the sport psychologists. On average, the psychologists conduct 20 individual sessions per week and also meet weekly with teams as the need arises.

The Atlantic Coast Conference

THE TRADITION

Consistency. It is the mark of true excellence in any endeavor.

However, in today's intercollegiate athletics, competition has become so balanced and so competitive that it is virtually impossible to maintain a high level of consistency.

Yet the Atlantic Coast Conference has defied the odds. Now in its 54th year of competition, the ACC has long enjoyed the reputation as one of the strongest and most competitive intercollegiate conferences in the nation. And that is not mere conjecture, the numbers support it.

Since the league's inception in 1953, ACC schools have captured 100 national championships, including 52 in women's competition and 48 in men's. In addition, NCAA individual titles have gone to ACC student-athletes 130 times in men's competition and 71 times in women's action.

The conference made an immediate impact in women's soccer on the national college scene in the fall of 1987 when North Carolina captured the first of what would eventually be 13 national titles for the ACC. Since becoming a league sponsored sport, the Tar Heels have laid claim to 13 of the last 19 national championships, including eight consecutive titles between 1987 and 1994.

In 2005, the ACC championship would pit the top two seeds in No. 1 North Carolina versus No. 2 Virginia, a rematch of last year's championship final, at the SAS Soccer Complex in Cary, N.C. The Tar Heels reclaimed the league crown with a 4-1 win over the Cavaliers for their 16th conference title.

The ACC led all conferences with seven teams selected to the 2005 NCAA Tournament, including ACC newcomer Boston College, Clemson, Duke, Florida State, North Carolina, Virginia and Wake Forest. It marked the fourth time in the last five years that at least seven teams from the ACC received a bid into the national tournament. Four schools, Duke, Florida State, North Carolina and Virginia, all earned national seeds, tying a league-high, set back in 2003. Florida State, North Carolina and Virginia each advanced to the guarterfinals of the NCAA Tournament, while the Seminoles made it to the semifinals of the Women's College Cup under first-year head coach Mark Krikorian. The Seminoles have appeared in the College Cup twice over the last three years, the most by any other team in the ACC and the second most in the nation.

Five teams finished in the top 25 of three major polls (Soccer America, Soccer Buzz and NSCAA). North Carolina, Florida State and Virginia each finished in the top 10 of all three polls, while the Eagles of Boston College finished the 2005 season ranked No. 10 by NSCAA. The Tar

Heels' Heather O'Reilly was named a finalist for the Honda Award, while teammate Lori Chalupny, Virginia's Sarah Huffman and Florida State's Sel Kuralay earned Soccer America MVP accolades. Krikorian was named National Coach of the Year by Soccer America and Soccer Buzz.

The 11 schools that take to the field this fall under the ACC banner have garnered 102 first, second or third team NSCAA All-America distinctions, 47 National Player of the Year titles and 12 National Rookie of the Year honors. The ACC has also amassed 34 Academic All-Americans since 1986.

2005-06 IN REVIEW

The 2005-06 academic year concluded with the league pocketing an all-time high six national team titles and 15 individual NCAA crowns. In all, the ACC has won 57 national team titles over the last 16 years. The ACC has won two or more NCAA titles in 24 of the past 26 years.

THE CHAMPIONSHIPS

The conference will conduct championship competition in 25 sports during the 2006-07 academic year — 12 for men and 13 for women.

The first ACC championship was held in swimming on February 25, 1954. The conference did not conduct championships in cross country, wrestling or tennis during the first year.

The 12 sports for men include football, cross country, soccer, basketball, swimming, indoor and outdoor track, wrestling, baseball, tennis, golf and lacrosse. Fencing, which was started in 1971, was discontinued in 1981.

Women's sports were initiated in 1977 with the first championship meet being held in tennis at Wake Forest University.

Championships for women are currently conducted in cross country, volleyball, field hockey, soccer, basketball, swimming, indoor and outdoor track, tennis, golf, lacrosse, softball and rowing.

A HISTORY

The Atlantic Coast Conference was founded on May 8, 1953, at the Sedgefield Inn near Greensboro, N.C., with seven charter members Clemson, Duke, Maryland, North Carolina, North
 Carolina State, South Carolina and Wake Forest
 drawing up the conference by-laws.

The withdrawal of seven schools from the Southern Conference came early on the morning of May 8, 1953, during the Southern Conference's annual spring meeting. On June 14, 1953, the seven members met in Raleigh, N.C., where a set of bylaws was adopted and the name became officially the Atlantic Coast Conference.

Suggestions from fans for the name of the new conference appeared in the region's newspapers prior to the meeting in Raleigh. Some of the names suggested were: Dixie, Mid South, Mid Atlantic, East Coast, Seaboard, Colonial, Tobacco, Blue-Gray, Piedmont, Southern Seven and the Shoreline.

Duke's Eddie Cameron recommended that the name of the conference be the Atlantic Coast Conference, and the motion was passed unanimously. The meeting concluded with each member institution assessed \$200.00 to pay for conference expenses.

On December 4, 1953, conference officials met again at Sedgefield and officially admitted the University of Virginia as the league's eighth member. The first, and only, withdrawal of a school from the ACC came on June 30, 1971, when the University of South Carolina tendered its resignation.

The ACC operated with seven members until April 3, 1978, when the Georgia Institute of Technology was admitted. The Atlanta school had withdrawn from the Southeastern Conference in January of 1964.

The ACC expanded to nine members on July 1, 1991, with the addition of Florida State University.

The conference expanded to 11 members on July 1, 2004, with the addition of the University of Miami and Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University. On October 17, 2003, Boston College accepted an invitation to become the league's 12th member starting July 1, 2005.
