
Since its founding in 1872, Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University, commonly known as Virginia Tech, has grown to become the state's largest university and its top research institution. It has evolved into a comprehensive university of national and international prominence.

Recognizing that higher education is a key force behind the quality of American life, its economic competitiveness, and our democratic form of government, President Charles W. Steger has now challenged the university to become one of the nation's top 30 research schools by the end of the decade.

The university is organized into eight colleges: Agriculture and Life Sciences, Architecture and Urban Studies, Arts and Sciences, Pamplin College of Business, Engineering, Human Resources and Education, Natural Resources, and Virginia-Maryland Regional College of Veterinary Medicine. Together, they offer about 170 bachelor's, master's, and doctoral degree programs.

Many of Virginia Tech's traditions and strengths are rooted in the university's motto, Ut Prosim: "That I May Serve," and its land-grant missions of instruction, research, and solving the problems of society through public service and outreach activities. Through the generation of new knowledge and the outreach mandate, Virginia Tech disseminates practical knowledge through the classroom and to society as a whole. It is a university that puts knowledge to work.

Hokies a Part of One Of The Nation's Finest Conferences

Winning on the athletic fields, in the arenas and in the classroom, The BIG EAST Conference continues its mission to be successful at the highest levels.

In 2000-01, the league again was well represented on the national scene by its student-athletes for accomplishments in academics and in athletic competition.

Two national championships were added to the BIG EAST's list last year. The Connecticut men's soccer team won the 2000 College Cup to give the league its second men's soccer title in the last five years. In women's

basketball, the BIG EAST became the first conference to have two different teams win the national crown in back-to-back seasons when Notre Dame hoisted the trophy at the 2001 Final Four. Connecticut

had won in 2000.

Additionally, three studentathletes won individual titles in NCAA competition.

Providence's Keith Kelly became the league's first NCAA men's cross country champion. Boston College runner Shannon Smith took the 3,000-meter title at the 2001 NCAA Indoor Track & Field Championship and Notre Dame's Ryan Shay was the 10,000-meter champion at the outdoor meet.

The BIG EAST has always been able to boast that some of its best students are also some of its best athletes. Ruth Riley, the 2000-01 BIG EAST Female Scholar-Athlete of the Year, was named the women's basketball national player of the year. She was also honored as the Verizon/CoSIDA Academic All-American Team Member of the Year. Boston College soccer player Chris Hamblin, the 2000-01 BIG EAST Male Scholar-Athlete of the Year, also earned first team All-America honors. Last year, 19 student-athletes earned academic All-America honors, including nine who were awarded first team accolades.

For three of the last seven years a BIG EAST student-athlete has won the Honda-Broderick Cup as Collegiate Woman of the Year. Notre Dame soccer player Cindy Daws won in 1997-98. She followed Connecticut basketball players Rebecca Lobo ('94-95) and Jennifer Rizzotti ('95-96).

BIG EAST student-athletes have continued their success after leaving the classrooms and playing fields. Former Connecticut women's basketball standout Dr. Leigh Curl was inducted into the GTE Academic All-America Hall of Fame in 1999. Former Georgetown men's basketball star Dikembe

Mutumbo was named a winner of the President's Service Award, the highest honor in the U.S. for volunteer service.

Whether it's the student-athletes or the league as an entity, moving forward successfully and exploring new horizons have been the norm rather than the exception for the conference that opened its doors in 1979.

The conference welcomed Virginia Tech as its 14th full member in 2000-01. In the spring of 2001, the BIG EAST added women's lacrosse to its growing list of sports.

When the 1990s began, The BIG EAST
Conference had just completed its eighth
season with nine members. The league
was arguably as healthy as a
conference could be. The BIG EAST
was a headline-grabber

based programs, led by administrators and coaches who place a constant emphasis on academic integrity. The BIG EAST Conference has enjoyed a leadership role nationally. Its student-athletes own significantly high graduation rates and their record of scholastic achievement notably reflect a balance between intercollegiate athletics and academics.

Any successful consortium enjoys outstanding leadership. Michael Tranghese, the league's first full-time employee, and for 11 years the associate of Dave Gavitt, took

over the

Commissioner's reins in June, 1990. The expansion in membership is only a portion of Tranghese's achievements. In his first year at the helm, he administered the formation of The BIG EAST Football Conference in addition to coordinating the four expansions.

BIG EAST sports attract the interest of followers in the nation's largest media markets including New York, Chicago, Philadelphia, Boston, Washington, D.C., Miami, Pittsburgh and Hartford. The league has long been considered a leader in innovative concepts in promotion and publicity, particularly regarding television. Those efforts have resulted in unparalleled visibility for BIG EAST student-athletes. Exclusive long-range television contracts with CBS, ESPN, Inc. and ABC provide BIG EAST basketball and football with more television exposure.

While BIG EAST basketball games are regular sellouts at campus and major public arenas, including the annual BIG EAST Championship in Madison Square Garden, attendance figures also are significant at BIG EAST soccer, women's basketball and baseball games.

More than 450 BIG EAST athletes have earned All-America recognition and dozens have won individual NCAA national championships. The BIG EAST has been well-represented in U.S. or foreign national and Olympic teams, with several athletes earning gold medals in the summer Olympiads in Sydney in 2000, Atlanta in '96, Barcelona in '92, Seoul in '88 and Los Angeles in '84.

The BIG EAST has its headquarters in Providence where the conference administers to more than 5,000 athletes in 21 sports.

immediately, especially in men's basketball, its signature sport. The BIG EAST Football Conference did not exist.

The '90s was a decade of enormous change in college athletics with conferences adding new members and new leagues beginning. The BIG EAST was no different than most groups. The league has had four separate expansions in the past 10 years. The BIG EAST Football Conference, with eight members, became a major player in college football immediately after its inception in 1991.

The BIG EAST became a reality on May 31, 1979, following a meeting of athletic directors from Providence College, St. John's, Georgetown and Syracuse Universities.

Seton Hall, Connecticut and Boston College completed the original seven-school alliance. After one season, Villanova was added and began play in 1980-81. Two seasons later, Pittsburgh joined the group and started competition in '82-83.

Miami was admitted in 1990 and began BIG EAST competition in '91-92. Rutgers, West Virginia and Notre Dame joined in '94 in two separate expansions and began play in 1995-96.

While the membership has increased, the focus of the BIG EAST remains unchanged. It is a group that reflects a tradition of broad-

Men's Outlook

Young Hokies Looking for BIG EAST Title

The men's team might appear to be down this year, at least on paper. With the loss of eight seniors who were the foundation of the program, this season has all the makings of being a rebuilding year.

But looking at the actual resumes of the incoming freshmen, coupled with the returning talent Coach Ned Skinner has coming back, this team could make a run at the conference title.

"It should be as good, if not a better men's team than Virginia Tech has ever had," Skinner said. "In every event, there are strong swimmers and depth. Couple that with very strong diving and you have a very good team. Overall, the men's team looks to be a factor in the BIG EAST."

SPRINTERS

Sprint freestyle has been an area where the Hokies have wanted to get stronger. The transfer of **Pat Fuller** from lowa should be a great addition as he joins **Steve Tozer**, who has been a very strong sprinter for the Hokies.

Brian Piantadosi worked on his strength over the summer and should be a factor. Joel Cross comes to the team with times ranking him in the top four all-time at Tech in the 50 free. Christian Lindberg, Mike Peterson and Chris Bassler will also be involved in these events.

DISTANCE FREESTYLE

The distance freestylers are anchored by junior **Greg Kubovcik**, who will challenge in all three distance events at the BIG EAST meet. Newcomers **Court Freedman**, **Eric Pavlik** and **Keith Gettys**

have posted times that could score at the BIG EAST Championships in the 1,650 freestyle. **David Szabo** has been a very strong contributor in these events as well.

FREESTYLE

One of the men's main strengths will be the 200 and 500 freestyle events. Peterson just missed the school record in the 500 free (held by **Rob Duffy**) and holds the record in the 200 free. He has a lot of speed and ability and will lead this group.

Pavlik is another strong freestyler who should add

great strength in the middle distance freestyle events. Bassler is capable of swimming fast in any freestyle event and is an asset to the Hokies during the season and in the postseason. **Aaron Sherman** could add great depth and speed in any of the freestyle events.

BACKSTROKE

The backstroke will be a big rebuilding effort for the Hokies as they graduated two school record holders. However, Lindberg was the team's top 200 backstroker last year and is poised for big things this year.

Steve Horning returns for his senior year as one of the top backstrokers in recent school history. Bassler scored at the BIG EAST meet in the 100 back and is looking to step up his efforts. Aaron Sherman will be asked to contribute here as well.

BREASTSTROKE

This crew could easily be one of the top breaststroke squads in the nation as the top performers return.

Szabo shattered the school record in the 200 breast and is looking for a conference title this year. **Joey Piekarski** and **Matt Lewis** are two very strong breaststrokers who could help the team.

David Litchfield will add very good depth in both the 100 and 200 breaststroke events. Newcomer Kevin Furlong should make the squad capable of scoring numerous points in several events at the BIG EAST Championships.

BUTTERFLY

The loss of Troy Hoff will force the 200 butterfly crew to step up to fill his shoes. **Rob Duffy** is just the man for the job as he has been one of the team's top butterfliers for three years. Cross will be very strong in the 100 while Pavlik is strong in the 200.

Tozer could be a driving force in the 100 fly and could be a strong part of the medley relay team. **Felipe Leibholz** and Piantadosi each had a great summer of training and the coaches are expecting big things from them.

INDIVIDUAL MEDLEY

The individual medley is another area where the Hokies are strong. Piekarski returns as the team's top 200 IMer while newcomer **Joe Tan** could be a strong factor in both the 200 and 400 IM. Szabo and Kubovcik both scored at the BIG EAST last year. Horning and Bassler have had strong IM careers and will be looked upon for points at the conference meet.

DIVING

Having lost two strong senior divers, the men's diving team will could to junior **Matt Bolen** for leadership. Bolen had a strong sophomore campaign, finishing in the top 16 at the conference meet.

Newcomer **Doug Roper** looks to make a big impact after having completed a strong summer of Junior Olympic diving. Freshman **Chris Peterson** also looks to contribute here.

Momen's Outlook

Experience, Depth Have Women's Team Looking for Greatness

The women's team is used to winning. After two consecutive Atlantic 10 titles, the women took second last year in their first season in the BIG EAST. This year, they want to get back to the top.

"The women's team appears to be the best team we've ever put together," said head coach **Ned Skinner**. "They have depth, speed, distance and competitive spirit.
They were pleased with their second-place finish last year, but would like to hang another banner up at the pool."



The sprint freestyle crew has to replace Lindsey Tew, but Jill Turner and Meagan Drolet continue to be a strong tandem. Newcomer Whitney Johnsen has excellent size, strength and mechanics and will be an immediate factor. Newcomer Katy Peterson may be asked to swim the sprint events. Jen McLaughlin will likely be moved to the 50 free to complete a very strong crew. Jackie Arnold and Erin Veltman will provide depth here.

DISTANCE

The distance freestyle crew should be a strong point for the Hokies. Allyson Hamilton returns after a strong first year in Blacksburg. Jamie Spradlin is one of the team's top freestylers and newcomers Annie Moore and Sarah Gardner are very strong from the 500 free and up. Erin Milfeit was on track to win the conference title in the 500 freestyle. She is expected to contend once again this year. Lindsey Saufley will add depth in the 1,650 and 500 free events and has a good chance to score at the conference meet.

FREESTYLE

The freestyle events for the women are very strong as just about 50 percent of the team is capable of scoring points on any day. Milfeit will once again lead the way, anchoring the crew. She holds the school record in both the 200 and 500 freestyle.

Turner has grown into a very strong freestyler, as has Drolet and both should help in these events. The addition of



freshmen **Jeanette Batten**, Gardner, Johnsen and Moore will make an already strong freestyle crew even stronger.

INDIVIDUAL MEDLEY

The women IMers are anchored by **Kelly Furlong**, who holds the school record in the 200 IM. But the door is open for others to emerge in this area. **Lauren Tower**, **Jen Siegele**, **Paige Sample** and Peterson all look to score for the Hokies in the 200 IM

Hamilton was the team's top performer in the 400 IM last year. **Kristen Laine** and **Alyson Dabney** will be counted on to score points in the 400 IM.

BACKSTROKE

The backstroke could be the team's strongest area this year. Peterson and Furlong should place in the top five of the 100 backstroke at the conference meet. Siegele, Trivett and Arnold lend strength.

The 200 back has the potential to be the team's best event as Milfeit, Furlong, Gardner and Peterson all have excellent chances of going below the two-minute barrier. The depth of Trivett and Arnold should lend a lot of strength in this event.

BUTTERFLY

The butterfly crew has to replace Tew, but returns McLaughlin, who has been one of the team's best swimmers in this area. The addition of Veltman and Batten will increase the strength in the sprint events.

Siegele will continue to be strong in the 100 fly as it is one of her top events. The 200 butterfly group is led by Hamilton and Laine.

BREASTSTROKE

This area will have five women who should be strong threats both in dual meets and in the postseason. Jen Brielmaier returns after just missing the school records a year ago. The 100 breaststroke has newcomers Kelly Burke and Tower, who should be strong threats. Sample and Dabney are two of the team's best in this area and should be back to form this year.

The 200 breaststroke event should have a lot of success with Brielmaier leading the way. Dabney, Furlong, Laine and Tower will be strong factors in this event as well.

DIVING

The women's diving team has a great deal of potential this year with depth and strength being big factors.

Sophomores Katie Grossi and Kayleen Gloor will lead the way after strong freshman years.

The team will be bolstered by the addition of newcomers **Robin Wood**, a junior college transfer who won the NJCAA National Championship, **Kaelynn Moury** and **Julie Siegel**.

Coach Ned Skinner



Ned Skinner, fresh off leading both the men's and women's teams to top three finishes in their first year in the BIG EAST, opens his fourth year at the helm of the Virginia Tech men's and

women's swimming and diving teams.

Last year's high finish in a new conference was no fluke. In his first two years as head coach of the Hokie swimming and diving squads, Skinner was named the Atlantic 10's Women's Coach of the Year twice, led the women's team to two Atlantic 10 Championships, while the men won their first conference title ever.

He has also founded the Fighting Gobbler Swim Camp, a one-week swim camp held at Virginia Tech.

Skinner came to the Hokies after serving four years as the director of competitive swimming at William & Mary. In his last season at W&M, he coached the Tribe women to a second place finish at the ECAC's while the men were fourth of 40 teams. The women's team finished in the top 12 at the ECAC event during each of Skinner's four seasons.

The W&M men's team posted a fourth-place showing at the '98 ECAC Championships and finished seventh in 1997. During Skinner's tenure, both the men's and women's squads were named Academic All-America Teams four straight years.

Skinner also coached Kristen Schnittger to four consecutive ECAC titles in the 100 breaststroke at the College of William & Mary.

Before his stint at William & Mary, Skinner was the head coach and aquatics director at Central Connecticut State University for four seasons.

A 1989 graduate of Louisiana State University, Skinner was captain of the 1988 squad that captured the SEC Championship. He graduated from LSU with a bachelor of arts in advertising and a split minor in marketing and economics. His fifth year he served as an assistant to the associate athletics director. Skinner earned his masters of science at Ohio University in athletic administration while serving the swim team as a graduate assistant. While at Ohio University, he helped coach the women's team to the 1990 MAC Championship.

On the non-collegiate level, Skinner founded, directed and coached the Central Connecticut Aquatics team, a 75-member team of children from ages 7 to 17. He also served as the head swim coach for the Kingsmill swim team in Williamsburg.

While in Williamsburg, Skinner conducted Team Williamsburg Swim Camps which provided the community with clinics and camps year round.

Skinner is married to the former Allison Cox, who is an attorney for Woods, Rogers & Hazelgrove in Roanoke. A native of Worthington, Ohio, Skinner is working on his doctorate in health promotions.

A native of Jenkintown, Pa., Coffey is single and resides in Blacksburg. He enjoys watching Philadelphia Flyers hockey games in his spare time.



Season in Review

H₂okies Make Big Splash in New Conference

After dominating the Atlantic 10 Conference in its final years as a member, Virginia Tech's swimming & diving teams took their acts to a new conference and exceeded all expectations.

Both squads made a splash in The BIG EAST Conference in the 2000-01 season as the women took second and the men placed third.

In all, what was supposed to be a good season in a new home turned out to be an exceptional one as the Hokies pulled some upsets, won numerous meets and placed higher than anyone believed possible at the BIG EAST Championships.

The women, who went 6-4 in dual meet action, started the season with an easy 148-92 victory over BIG EAST rival West Virginia at home. After dropping meets to Maryland and Notre Dame at War Memorial Pool, the women responded by reeling off wins at Richmond, George Washington and Maryland-Baltimore County.

The team then headed to Chapel Hill, N.C., for the Nike Cup and placed second in a competitive field. The second half of the season saw the team pick up wins against James Madison and Pittsburgh before heading to New York for the conference meet.

At that meet, Lindsey Tew won the 50 freestyle, and the 400 freestyle relay team of Jill Turner, Meagan Drolet, Meg Freese and Tew won its event to help the team to a strong finish.

Erin Milfeit had a great meet for the Hokies, taking second in the 200 back and fourth in both the 200 and 500 freestyle events. Jill Turner finished third in the 500 freestyle and fifth in the 100 freestyle while Kelly Furlong placed fourth in the 200 back.

Also performing well at the conference meet were Ally Hamilton (6th, 400 IM), Jen McLaughlin (5th, 200 fly; 6th, 100 fly), Katie Grossi (16th, 3-meter) and Jamie Spradlin (6th, 500 free).

The women's relay teams were also solid as the 400 medley relay team took second and the 200 medley relay team placed third.

The men's team, which went 5-5 in dual meets, also opened the season with a big win over conference foe West Virginia.

After dropping a meet to Maryland, the Hokies came back to pull off a dramatic victory over Notre Dame. Holding a slim lead and needing to win the final event to win the meet, Ray Hrabe came from behind in the final lap of the 400 freestyle relay to win the race and clinch the dramatic victory over the Irish.

After wins over George Washington and Maryland-Baltimore County, the Hokies placed sixth at the Nike Cup before falling to North Carolina in the final meet of the semester.

In the second half of the season, the Hokies picked up a win against instate rival James Madison and fared well against tough N.C. State and Pittsburgh squads before heading off to the BIG EAST Championships.

Although the Hokies didn't have any individual winners, they used depth and balance to rack up points in numerous events, helping them to a third-place finish. At the meet, the team scored 417 points and represented Tech well in its first appearance at the conference meet.

David Szabo placed second in the 200 breast while Greg Kubovcik placed third in the 1,650 freestyle. Joey

Piekarski also had a good meet as he placed fifth in the 200 IM and sixth in the 200 breast. The 200 medley relay team placed fourth and the 400 freestyle relay took sixth.

The Hokies also had an amazing year in terms of breaking schools records as a combined 18 school marks fell in the 2000-01 season. The women shattered 10 marks while the men bested eight.

On the men's side, Michael Peterson, Kubovcik, Steve Tozer, Brett Saum, Drew Killiam and Szabo each broke an individual mark.

Included in that group was Tew breaking the 17-year-old record in the 100 freestyle formerly held by Linda Krumweide (51.53). Tew crushed that record at the BIG EAST meet, clocking in with a time of 50.37, breaking the record by over a second. Tew broke two other marks (50 free, 100 fly) and Milfeit broke the records in the 200 back and 200 free. Furlong also broke the record in the 50 back event.

The end of the season also meant a good-bye to a group of 12 who helped build the Virginia Tech swimming & diving program up to where it is today. Buffy Marshall, Freese, Jordan Huegerich, Hrabe, Tew, Troy Hoff, Jeff Bresnei, Shawn Lewis, Brian Russ, Saum, Killian and Gregg Doulé will always be remembered for the hard work and dedication they put into the program.







Mar Memorial Pool

War Memorial Pool, located just off the campus drillfield in War Memorial Gym, is Virginia Tech's swimming and diving facility. The complex includes a 25-yard pool with eight lanes and a diving well. The movable bulkhead which separates the pool from the diving well can be adjusted to lengthen the pool to 25 meters.

Complete with underwater windows and sound system, the facility is also equipped with the Colorado Electronic Timing System and scoreboard. Two years ago, a 12-line readout scoreboard was installed for swimming, as well as a three-line scoreboard for diving.

The diving well is made up of two one-meter boards, a three-meter board and a five-meter platform.

The pool has served as the site for two Virginia State Championship meets and one Metro Conference Championship.

War Memorial Gym itself houses numerous other facilities including saunas, weight rooms, racquetball courts and six basketball courts. The Hokies also have the use of other equipment such as powerracks for strength swimming and VASA trainers, VASA climbers and bicycles for dry land.

War Memorial Pool, home of the Hokie swim team, was originally built in the early 1920s, but was renovated and moved in March of 1975.

Since then, numerous records at the pool have come and gone, but some have lasted longer than others. Mike Haynes of Clemson still holds the record in the 200 breast. This record was set on Nov. 12, 1989.

Last year, 10 women's pool records were broken, two of which were broken by Hokies (Lyndsey Tew & 200 freestyle relay). The men had 12 War Memorial Pool records broken, two of which were by members of the Tech team. Troy Hoff and Michael Peterson set those records.

Rick Aronberg's 11-year-old record in the 1,000 free was broken on Dec. 2, 2000.

Item: Virginia Tech applications up 15 percent. Entering students have highest SAT average ever. Virginia Tech competes for national championship in football. University announces two new mega biotech programs. Things are looking pretty rosy for Virginia Tech, right?

Enter Charles W. Steger. His assessment? "We have to rev the engines even higher. If you're not moving quickly forward, you might as well be standing still," says the energetic 54-year-old president.

Appointed president by the university board effective January 7, 2000, Steger possesses the breadth and depth of experience to lead Virginia Tech at the point when higher education must learn to cope with major technology changes permeating education.

Steger has lofty goals for Virginia's leading research university. "I would like to see us ranked among the nation's top 30

universities before the end of the decade," says Steger.

A registered architect and former dean of Tech's college of

A registered architect and former dean of Tech's college of architecture and urban studies, Steger was the architect of a different sort as the leader of the university's successful fund raising campaign. Under his leadership as vice president for development and university relations, the Campaign for Virginia Tech, which concluded in 1998, raised \$337 million, \$87 million over its goal.

Steger's ties to Virginia Tech span four decades as a student, professor, dean, vice president, and now president. While on the faculty, he twice won teaching excellence awards. When he became dean of the college in 1981, he was the youngest architecture dean in the nation at 33 years of age.

Steger received his Bachelor and Masters of Architecture and a Ph.D. in Environmental Science and Engineering from Virginia Tech. He and his wife, Janet, have two sons — David and Christopher.

JIM WEAVER • Director Of Athletics



James C. Weaver, whose innovative ideas and work as a reformer have made him one of college athletics' most popular administrators, is the director of athletics at Virginia Tech.

Weaver, 56, was appointed on September 24, 1997 and has been a tireless leader in

behalf of Tech athletics. In his four years on the job at Tech, Weaver has taken steps to place increased emphasis on projects benefiting student-athletes. He created a comprehensive awards program for letterwinners and has initiated and funded an annual awards banquet.

Weaver's biggest accomplishment thus far has been getting Tech admitted into an all-sports conference. Tech entered competition in the BIG EAST Conference for most sports during the 2000-2001 season.

A top personal priority for Weaver is the area of facilities, where he has major plans for the expansion of Lane Stadium/Worsham Field. Already complete is the expansion of the North end zone that totals over 5,000 permanent seats.

Weaver has spearheaded a construction project to expand stadium seating capacity to 65,000 for the 2002 season. The \$37 million expansion project will include an 11,000-seat double deck and provide 15 luxury suites, as well as

club level seating and amenities.

Plans are underway for a West side pressbox and suite expansion for 2003. The West side expansion, along with 36 suites, will include an enhanced pressbox tower, as well as office space for ticket operations and the Virginia Tech Athletic Fund.

In the Fall of 2000, Weaver arranged a joint venture with ISP to commit \$2 million to purchase new scoreboards, upgraded sound systems, a 21x28 L.E.D. video display screen at Lane Stadium and two 9x12 wall mount L.E.D. video screens in Cassell Coliseum. A state of the art television control studio provides in-house production and operations for the video screens. The video screens and new sound systems have noticeably heightened game

entertainment and the overall fan experience at Lane Stadium and Cassell Coliseum.

A native of Harrisburg, Pa., Weaver came to Tech from Western Michigan University where he was director of athletics from January, 1996 until he came to Blacksburg. Prior to that, he was AD for three and a half years at UNLV, where he reconstructed a troubled athletics department.

Prior to landing the athletic director's job at UNLV, Weaver spent nine years at the University of Florida. He was a strong force at Florida in the field of compliance and concluded his time there as associate athletic director.

"Jim Weaver was the unanimous choice of our search committee," retired Tech President Paul Torgersen said at a Blacksburg news conference when the new AD was introduced. "The committee was searching for someone with extensive Division I experience, a commitment to compliance, a commitment to gender equity, a commitment to all 21 varsity sports and a vision for conference alignment."

Weaver graduated from Penn State in 1967 with a bachelor's in psychology and rehabilitation education. He received a master's degree in college counselor education from Penn State in 1968.

Weaver and his wife Traci have four sons - Josh, Paul, Cole and Craig.

Support Programs

STUDENT-ATHLETE ACADEMIC SUPPORT SERVICES

The success of Virginia Tech's swimming and diving program rests largely on the academic progress of each student-athlete. The academic performance of Tech student-athletes has improved each year due in part to the Student-Athlete Academic Support Services (SAASS).

The Virginia Tech graduation rate for student-athletes has risen significantly in recent years and reached 67 percent in 2001 as compared to the national average of 58 percent. The projected 2002 student-athlete graduation rate is over 70 percent which will mark the fourth time in the last nine years that Tech has reached that level.

Last spring, the Athletic Director's Honors Breakfast paid tribute to a record 337 student-athletes, student trainers, student managers, cheerleaders and HighTechs who posted 3.0 or greater QCAs in the 2000 calendar year.

To accommodate the many facets of assistance needed for student-athletes, Virginia Tech's mission is eight fold:

1. To provide services to all studentathletes, including any student participating in any varsity sport, managers, trainers, cheerleaders and HighTechs.

- To provide academic support through tutoring programs, computer facilities and software which are necessary for the individual needs of each student.
- To require a mandatory study hall for students below expected QCA levels in order that the staff might better assist the at-risk student-athletes.
- To provide adequate study facilities and a computer lab which are conveniently located near the training areas and coaching areas.
- 5. To provide mentoring, counseling, academic assistance, advising and to work closely with other academic offices on campus for the welfare of the students.
- To work closely with the athletic department for the academic welfare of each student-athlete and to help in the development of an effective student life program.
- To closely monitor the academic success of each student to help ensure academic progress toward a degree and maintenance of academic and athletic eligibility.
 - 8. To encourage former athletes to be

actively involved with our present athletes and to provide our services to former athletes who did not graduate and assist them in their academic planning toward a degree. The ultimate goal

is for all student-athletes to successfully complete their degree.

Chris Helms, in his third year at Tech, is the director and is responsible for the development and leadership of the Student Athlete Academic Support Services office.

Assisting him are associate directors Lois Berg and Colin Howlett, Katie Ammons, Renia Edwards, Becky Kolenbrander and Terrie Repass.

ATHLETIC PERFORMANCE

Thanks to the direction of Assistant Athletic Director for Athletic Performance Mike Gentry, the Virginia

Tech strength and conditioning program is among the best in the nation.

The swimming and diving teams train in the Jim "Bulldog" Haren Weight Room. Located in Jamerson Athletic Center,

the 5,000-square foot weight room was officially dedicated in September 1985 to Haren, a former Hokie football player and long-time supporter of the Virginia Tech Athletic Department.

Gentry is in his 14th season as the Hokies' director of strength and conditioning. As assistant athletics director for athletic performance, his duties include overseeing the strength and conditioning training of athletes in all 21 varsity sports at Virginia Tech.

Assisting Gentry in the weight room this year are three full-time assistant strength and conditioning coaches: Jay Johnson, assistant director of strength and conditioning, Terry Mitchell, strength and conditioning coordinator of men's Olympic sports and Emily Chones, strength and conditioning coordinator for women's Olympic sports. Gentry will also have the services of three graduate assistants — Erin O'Neil, Tim Ralph and Shannon Turly.

Sports Nutrition

A new program was added to the athletics department in July 2000 — sports nutrition.

In addition to her responsibilities as coordinator of student life, Amy Freel also has the duties of being the athletics department's sports nutritionist.

Freel works one-on-one with studentathletes to provide them with information that they need on their diet. She also provides individual players with diet counseling on issues such as gaining lean muscle mass, losing body fat, and how to eat to improve performance.

The sports nutritionist works with the "Training Edge", a dining option for health-conscious students and athletes, to design menus for training tables and daily menu selections.

Sports Psychology

A new addition to the athletics department as of August 2000 is sports psychology. The licensed psychologists, Dr. Brenna Chirby, Dr. Gary Bennett, and Dr. Robert Miller, Associate Director of the Thomas E. Cook Counseling Center, counsel student-athletes either individually or as a team.

The psychologists meet with studentathletes on an individual basis for personal counseling, performance enhancement and to discuss the mental aspects of the game. As a team, the sports psychologists work on team building, communication and performance enhancement.

The psychologists also offer an injury group to afford injured athletes the opportunity to meet with other injured athletes and talk about their recovery process. Injured athletes may also meet individually with the sports psychologists if they do not feel comfortable in the group.

The sports psychology office reaches out to athletes who may not have considered going to the counseling service that is offered to all students at Virginia Tech.
