Polytechnic Institute and State University, popularly known as Virginia Tech, has grown

from a small college of 132 students into Virginia's largest university and its top research institution. During its 130 years of existence, Virginia's premiere land-grant institution has evolved into a comprehensive university of national and international prominence.

Recognizing that higher education is a key force behind the quality of American life, our economic competitiveness, and our democratic form of government, President Charles W. Steger has challenged the university to become one of the country's top 30 research institutions by the end of the

Virginia Tech is organized into eight colleges — Agriculture and Life Sciences, Architecture and Urban Studies, Arts and Sciences, Pamplin College of Business, Engineering, Human Resources and Education,

Natural Resources, and Virginia-Maryland Regional College of Veterinary Medicine. Plans have been approved to restructure the university, which will result in the creation of a College of Biological, Mathematical, and Physical Sciences next year. Together, the colleges offer about 175 bachelor's, master's, and doctoral degree programs to approximately 26,000 undergraduate and graduate students.

Many of Virginia Tech's traditions and strengths are rooted in the university's motto, Ut Prosim ("That I May Serve") and its land-grant missions of instruction, research, and outreach. By generating new knowledge through research and through its outreach mandate, Virginia Tech disseminates practical knowledge both in and out of the classroom, reaching beyond its student body to affect society as a whole. Virginia Tech — a university that puts knowledge to work.

## Hokies a Part of One of The Nation's Finest Conferences

As The BIG EAST Conference enters the 2002-03 season, only the 24th in its history, it takes pride in its long list of accomplishments.

Providing opportunities to excel amongst the nation's best, both athletically and academically, continues to be its mission.

There was plenty of evidence of that mission being accomplished during the 2001-02 season. The BIG EAST had undefeated national champions in football and women's basketball, 32 student-athletes who earned

Academic All-America honors, and two studentathletes who were named the national player of the year in their sports.

Miami won the Rose
Bowl to cap a perfect 120 season for its fifth national
title and second for the
league. The Connecticut
women's basketball team garnered
its third national title with a recordsetting 39-0 mark.

That national championship gave the Conference a three-peat in women's basketball following the Huskies' second title in 2000 and Notre Dame's crown in 2001. BIG EAST teams have won 10 national championships since 1995 in six different sports.

UConn's Sue Bird was the consensus women's basketball player of the year and Erin Elbe of Georgetown was honored with the women's lacrosse player of the year award.

The Notre Dame baseball team became the first conference team to play in the College World Series. The BIG EAST was the only conference to have eight teams compete in the NCAA Women's Soccer Championship.

The BIG EAST has always been able to boast that some of its best students are also some of its best athletes. Notre Dame softball standout Jarrah Myers, the 2001-02 BIG EAST/Aéropostale Female Scholar-Athlete of the Year, was honored as the Verizon/CoSIDA Academic All-American Team Member of the Year in addition to earning All-America honors for her accomplishments on the diamond.

For three of the last eight years, a BIG EAST student-athlete has won the Honda-Broderick Cup as Collegiate Woman of the Year. Notre Dame soccer player Cindy Daws won in 1997-98. She followed

Connecticut basketball players Rebecca Lobo ('94-95) and Jennifer Rizzotti ('95-96).

BIG EAST student-athletes have continued their success after leaving the classrooms and playing fields. Former Connecticut women's basketball standout Dr. Leigh Curl was inducted into the Verizon Academic All-America Hall of Fame in 1999. Former Georgetown men's basketball star Dikembe Mutumbo was named a winner of the President's Service Award, the highest honor in the U.S. for volunteer service.

Whether it's the student-athletes or the league as a whole, moving forward successfully and exploring new horizons have been the norm rather than

the exception for the conference that

opened its doors in 1979.

Most recently the league welcomed Virginia Tech as its 14th full member in 2000-01. In the spring of 2001, the BIG EAST added women's lacrosse to its growing list of sports. This past fall, it was announced that women's golf will be added to the list of championship sports.

When the 1990s began, The BIG EAST Conference had just completed its eighth season with nine members. The league was arguably as healthy as a conference could be. The BIG EAST was a headline-grabber immediately, especially in men's basketball, its signature sport. The BIG EAST Football Conference did not exist.

The '90s was a decade of enormous change in college athletics with conferences adding new members and new leagues beginning. The BIG EAST was no different than most groups. The league has had four separate expansions in the past 11 years. The BIG EAST Football Conference, with eight members, became a major player in college football immediately after its inception in 1991.

The BIG EAST became a reality on May 31, 1979, following a meeting of athletic directors from Providence College, St. John's, Georgetown and Syracuse Universities. Seton Hall, Connecticut and

Boston College completed the original seven school alliance.

After one season, Villanova was added and began play in 1980-81. Two seasons later, Pittsburgh joined the group and started competition in '82-83.

Miami was admitted in 1990 and began BIG EAST competition in '91-92. Rutgers, West Virginia and Notre Dame joined in '94 in two separate expansions and began play in 1995-96.

While the membership has increased, the focus of the BIG

EAST remains
unchanged. It is a

The BIG EAST
Conference has enjoyed a
leadership role nationally. Its
student athletes own significantly high
graduation rates and their record of
scholastic achievement notably reflects a
balance between intercollegiate athletics

and academics.

The expansion in membership is only a portion of Tranghese's achievements. In his first year at the helm, he administered the formation of The BIG EAST Football Conference in addition to coordinating the four expansions.

BIG EAST sports attract the interest of followers in the nation's largest media markets including New York, Chicago, Philadelphia, Boston, Washington, D.C., Miami, Pittsburgh and Hartford.

More than 475 BIG EAST athletes have earned All-America recognition and dozens have won individual NCAA national championships.

The BIG EAST Conference has been well represented in U.S. or foreign national and Olympic teams, with several athletes earning gold medals in the summer Olympiads in Sydney in 2000, Atlanta in 1996, Barcelona in 1992, Seoul in 1988 and Los Angeles in 1984.

The BIG EAST Conference has its headquarters in Providence, R.I., where the conference administers to more than 5,000 student-athletes in 22 sports.

## Men's Outlook Hokies Hoping Balance Leads to Title

With the loss of so many great seniors across the conference, Virginia Tech expects its quality class of seniors, coupled with its best recruiting class ever, to be contenders for the BIG EAST Conference title.

The 2002-03 men's team shows its strongest balance, in every event, during head coach Ned Skinner's tenure.

"There really are no weaknesses in our program," Skinner explained. "Many of the swimmers have the tools and talent to contend for conference titles and advance to the NCAA Championships."

#### **SPRINTERS**

Senior Brian Piantadosi, along with juniors Christian Lindberg and David Litchfield, will anchor the freestyle crew.

Piantadosi, a member of last year's school record-breaking 400 medley relay team, returns as the Hokies' top competitor in the 100 freestyle along with Lindberg, one of the conference's top performers last season in the sprint freestyle events.

Senior **Steve Tozer**, a sprint freestyler, will be a key component in all of the Hokies' relay events.

The addition of freshmen **Tom Alberi**, **Casey Moore** and **Marc Severin** to the mix gives Tech a strong group of sprinters this season. All three have the size, strength and success out of high school to help them become some of the finest swimmers the program has produced.

#### **DISTANCE FREESTYLE**

**Greg Kubovcik** returns for his final season as a leader and a very talented distance swimmer. Kubovcik is coming off a season highlighted by a third-place finish in the 1,650 at the BIG EAST meet.

Junior **David Szabo** and sophomore **Keith Gettys** are expected to make an impact in Tech's distance freestyle events.

Newcomers Matt Camden, Mike Della Noce and Phil Smith will also lend support to an already talented distance crew.

#### **FREESTYLE**

Junior Chris Bassler will see plenty of activity in the 200 freestyle events as will Tozer, junior Joey Piekarski and sophomore Kevin Furlong.

The men's team looks to have its finest crew of freestylers since the early 1990s, with as many as 12

different competitors seeing action in the freestyle events.

Aaron Sherman will see action in the sprint freestyle events (50 and 100) where he was a threat in relays last year.

Freshman **Trevor Jamerson** joins the team after capturing a YMCA national title last year and is a threat in every freestyle event from the 50 to the 1,650.

#### **BACKSTROKE**

Lindberg and Tozer will anchor the Hokies' backstroke crew. Last season, the two combined to take home three top-10 finishes at the conference meet.

The addition of freshman **Anders Frahm** should give Tech three potential swimmers to score in the top eight at the BIG EAST meet.

The versatile Bassler will also see action in the backstroke events along with Sherman. Severin and Alberi.

#### **BREASTSTROKE**

One of the premier specialists within the conference and nationally, Piekarski returns to the Hokies as an experienced competitor in the breaststroke. Last season, he claimed two second-place finishes at the BIG EAST Championships and holds the school record in the 200.

The Hokies will pose as viable contenders at the conference meet with Furlong in the 100, coupled with Litchfield and senior **Matt Lewis** in the sprint breaststroke events, and Szabo and Litchfield in the 200 events.

Smith, a freshman, will add versatility and depth in what is already a very deep breaststroke crew.

#### **BUTTERFLY**

Coach Skinner knows the void left behind by school record-holder Rob Duffy will not be an easy one to fill. However,

Frahm, a native of Denmark, comes to Tech as a fly specialist and is expected to vie for a conference championship.

**Felipe Liebholz** and Piantadosi are 100 fly specialists who give Tech strong depth and front-end speed in the fly events.

Jamerson is also expected to factor in on the butterfly crew this season.

Sophomore **Eric Pavlik** returns to give the Hokies strength in the 200 butterfly and will be a factor in the 100 butterfly events.

#### **INDIVIDUAL MEDLEY**

Piekarski and Szabo established themselves as two of the top BIG EAST IMers last season with two top-five and two top-10 finishes, respectively. The tandem, along with Smith, Severin and Bassler makes the team individual medley events a very strong component of Tech's program.

Kubovcik, a senior, will lend strength in the 400 IM event this season along with Furlong, Frahm and Della Noce.

#### DIVING

This year's diving crew consists of senior captain **Matt Bolen** and sophomore **Doug Roper**.

Bolen will vie for conference titles in his final season as a Hokie and looks to build on a ninth-place finish in the threemeter diving event at the conference meet.

Roper continues to fine tune his diving ability and will contend for a top-eight spot at this year's BIG EAST meet.

# Women's Outlook Hokies on Strong Path for Success

With the departure of only two seniors from last year's women's team that posted a near-perfect dual meet record, the 2002-03 Hokies will rely on a gifted group of upperclassmen to pave the road to success.

"Strong leadership and another strong recruiting class puts the women in a strong path for another successful season," head coach Ned Skinner stated. "The women's team has enough talented swimmers to send multiple women to the NCAA Championships and vie for a BIG EAST title."

#### **SPRINTERS**

Seniors **Jill Turner** and **Meagan Drolet** once again will anchor a very strong sprint crew for the Hokies.

Turner, the top proven sprinter in the 50, 100 and 200, cashed in with three top-10 finishes in freestyle events at the conference meet last year, highlighted by a third-place finish in the 50 freestyle.

Drolet, a member of the 400 freestyle relay team that captured the BIG EAST title in 2001, adds valuable conference meet experience after three top-15 finishes last year.

Newcomers **Juliana Daniell** and **Emily Guschke** will be called upon to make an immediate impact on the Hokie relays and individual swims.

Sophomore Whitney Johnsen and senior Jen McLaughlin will also be factors in this year's sprint events, while Jamie Trivett may see time in the 50 and 100 freestyle events.

#### **DISTANCE FREESTYLE**


Juniors **Jamie Spradlin** and **Lindsey Saufley** will once again be factors at both individual meets the conference level.

Spradlin hopes to pick up where she left off last year after she closed out the season by setting three personal-bests at the conference meet in the 200, 500 and 1,650 freestyle.

Katie Shipko and sophomore Sarah Gardner will add strength to an already strong portion of the team.

#### **FREESTYLI**

Across the board, Tech's freestyle events will be the staple of the 2002-03 squad. Similar to the men's team, the women will use as many as 12 different swimmers to assist in relays and individual events.



Spradlin and Turner are the most versatile swimmers and have proven to be among the top swimmers in the BIG EAST, thus having the ability to be a factor on any particular relay and at any event.

Drolet, **Kelly Furlong**, and **Katy Peterson** will also see a lot of freestyle work, including relays.

#### **INDIVIDUAL MEDLEY**

Furlong returns for her fourth, and final, season and looks to build on an 11th-place finish at the BIG EAST Championships in which she swam a personal best.

Kelly Burke, Paige Sample, Jen Brielmaier and Peterson will compete in the 200 IM, while Alyson Dabney, Spradlin and Furlong will be factors in the 400 IM.

#### **BACKSTROKE**

Peterson, a top-eight finisher in the 100 and 200 backstroke at the conference meet, and Furlong, who finished fifth in the 200 backstroke at the meet, return as the featured Hokies in the backstroke events.

Senior **Jen Siegele**, Johnsen, Guschke and freshman **Mandie Yothers** will add strength to the 100 backstroke, while Gardner, Peterson and Furlong will compete in the 200 backstoke along with Trivett.

#### **BUTTERFLY**

McLaughlin, the school record-holder in the 200 butterfly, ends her brilliant career as the top threat in the 100 and 200 fly. She was the only Hokie to capture an individual title last year and will defend her Championship at this year's meet.

Daniell, Siegele, **Erin Veltman** and Yothers will add strength in 100 fly events.

**Jeanette Batten**, along with Dabney, Furlong and McLaughlin, will rank among the top Hokies for the 200 butterfly.

#### **BREASTSTROKE**

Brielmaier, Burke and Sample continue their successful ways as a strong threesome in the breaststroke events.

Brielmaier earned two top-10 finishes at the BIG EAST Championships, including a seventh- place finish in the 200 breaststroke, while Burke set a school record with a sixth-place finish at the conference meet.

**Lauren Tower** adds strength to the Tech breaststroke crew and will compete in the 100 and 200 breaststroke.

#### **DIVING**

Tech's diving crew is arguably one of the deepest and strongest in the program's recent history.

Senior Robin Wood and junior Katie Grossi lead the group of divers. Wood joined the Hokies last season after transferring from Indian River C.C., where she was an NJCAA national champion. She upheld her reputation as a talented diver by capturing first place in one-meter diving at the James Madison meet.

Grossi, coming off two top-10 finishes at the BIG EAST meet, will continue to fine-tune her technical skills and vie for a conference title.

Sophomore **Julie Siegel**, along with freshmen **Claire Jakabcin** and **Jen Urbach**, round out the Tech divers for the 2002-03 season.

## Coach Ned Skinner



Ned Skinner, who has led the Hokies to the upper echelon of the BIG EAST, opens his fifth year at the helm of the Virginia Tech men's and women's swimming and diving teams.

In his first year in the BIG EAST, he led the women to a second-place finish while the men placed third. Last season,

the men duplicated their finish while the women went 9-1 in dual meets and placed fourth in the conference.

In his first two years as head coach of the Hokie swimming and diving squads, Skinner was named the Atlantic 10 Women's Coach of the Year twice and led the women's team to two Atlantic 10 Championships, while the men won their first conference title ever.

He has also founded the Fighting Gobbler Swim Camp, a one-week swim camp held at Virginia Tech. Skinner came to the Hokies after serving four years as the director of competitive swimming at William & Mary. In his last season at W&M, he coached the Tribe women to a second place finish at the ECAC's while the men were fourth of 40 teams. The women's team finished in the top 12 at the ECAC event during each of Skinner's four seasons.

The W&M men's team posted a fourth-place showing at the '98 ECAC Championships and finished seventh in 1997. During Skinner's tenure, both the men's and women's squads were named Academic All-America Teams four straight years.

Skinner also coached Kristen Schnittger to four consecutive ECAC titles in the 100 breaststroke at the College of William & Mary.

Before his stint at William & Mary, Skinner was the head coach and aquatics director at Central Connecticut State University for four seasons.

A 1989 graduate of Louisiana State University, Skinner was captain of the 1988 squad that captured the SEC Championship. He graduated from LSU with a bachelor of arts in advertising and a split minor in marketing and economics. His fifth year he served as an assistant to the associate athletics director. Skinner earned his masters of science at Ohio University in athletic administration while serving the swim team as a graduate assistant. While at Ohio University, he helped coach the women's team to the 1990 MAC Championship.

On the non-collegiate level, Skinner founded, directed and coached the Central Connecticut Aquatics team, a 75-member team of children from ages 7 to 17. He also served as the head swim coach for the Kingsmill swim team in Williamsburg.

While in Williamsburg, Skinner conducted Team Williamsburg Swim Camps which provided the community with clinics and camps year round.

Skinner is married to the former Allison Cox, who is an attorney for the honorable David Faber in Bluefield, W.Va. A native of Worthington, Ohio, Skinner is working on his doctorate in health promotions.

## Season In Review

#### Women Post Near-Perfect Dual Meet Record; Men Take Third at Conference

After losing a group of 12 studentathletes who helped to give the Virginia Tech swimming and diving program a smooth transition into the BIG EAST conference, many may have expected the 2001-2002 season to be a rebuilding year for the Hokies.

Instead, Tech showed its resilience with the women losing only one dual meet and the men taking a third place finish in the conference championship.

The women, who went 9-1 in dual meet action, started the season strong with three home wins versus the University of Connecticut, Richmond and Radford.

First, Tech edged UConn, 169-135, then the women cruised to two victories, downing Radford, 206-79, and Richmond, 163.5-130.5.

The Hokies stumbled in their first road trip, splitting a pair of dual meets at The Ohio State University. At the meet, the women dropped Ohio State, 152-91 and then were handed their only loss by Maryland, 136-107.

Remaining on the road, the women returned to their winning ways, beating Wright State, 135-87. The team then headed to Chapel Hill, N.C., for the Nike Cup Invitational and placed second in the field of eight for the second year in a row.

Tech returned home for the final meet before winter break and downed UMBC, 182-92. At that meet, Jill Turner broke the pool record with a victory in the 100 freestyle with a time of 51.59.

In their first meet following the break, the women had their best performance of the season, as they swept all 13 events and beat the host James Madison Dukes, 138-96. Next, in their final dual meet, the women took first place in 10 events to beat Pittsburgh, 143-85.

After a slow start at the three-day BIG EAST tournament, the women used depth, balance and perseverance to capture a come-from-behind fourth-place finish. Tech finished the meet with 405 points and several strong individual performances.

Jen McLaughlin put in Tech's best individual performance, giving the Hokies their only first place finish with a win in

the championship race of the 200 butterfly. After breaking the school record in the morning prelims, McLaughlin broke the record again with a time of 2:01.07 in the finals. A school record also fell in the championship race of the 200 breaststroke as Kelly Burke posted a time of 2:18.73.

The men, who finished the season 5-3 in dual meet action, defeated UConn to start the season. 176.5-115.5.

The team set two pool records at that meet as Rob Duffy posted a time of 1:51.23 in the 200 butterfly and the 800 freestyle relay team of Joel Cross, Michael Peterson, Duffy and Chris Bassler set the pool mark with a time of 7:04.70.

On their first road trip, the men split, beating Maryland, 136-105, and falling to Ohio State, 130-109.

The men remained on the road and moved to 3-1 on the season, downing Wright State, 130-113.

Returning to War Memorial Pool, the men captured a 162-136 victory over UMBC by taking first place in six individual races and one relay race.

The men had their best performance of the season, beating JMU, 142-94 and taking first place in 11 of 13 events.

Next, the men placed first in six events but came up short, losing to West Virginia, 116-121, to fall to 5-2 on the season.

In the final dual meet of the season, the men fell to No. 6 Pittsburgh, 64-179. In that meet, Joey Piekarski was the lone Hokie to take first place as he broke a pool record with a time of 1:54.26 in the 200 IM.

Like the women, the men also started slowly at the BIG EAST Tournament, but a stellar performance on the second day propelled the Hokies to a third place finish. In total, the men's team tied or broke five school records at the championships.

Piekarski was Tech's top male performer, tying one school record in the 200 IM with a time of 1:50.58 and breaking another, swimming a 2:01.23 in the 200 breaststroke.

Individual school records also fell in the 100 breaststroke and 100 butterfly. Kevin Furlong swam the 100 breast in a time of 55.74 and Duffy swam the 100 butterfly in a time of 48.61.

The 400 medley relay team of Steve Tozer, Furlong, Duffy and Brian Piantadosi placed third in the championship and shattered the school record with a time of 3:18.65.

In all, the 2001-2002 season proved to be more than a rebuilding year for both squads.

It was a season that saw 12 school records fall, a conference champion in the 200 butterfly, a near perfect season for the women and a third-place conference finish for the men.



## War Memorial Pool

War Memorial Pool, located just off the campus Drill Field in War Memorial Gym, is Virginia Tech's swimming and diving facility. The complex includes a 25-yard pool with eight lanes and a diving well. The movable bulkhead which separates the pool from

the diving well can be adjusted to lengthen the pool to 25 meters.

Complete with underwater windows and sound system, the facility is also equipped with the Colorado Electronic Timing System and scoreboard. Two years ago, a 12-line readout scoreboard was installed for swimming, as well as a three-line scoreboard for diving.


The diving well is made up of two one-meter boards, a three-meter board and a five-meter platform.

The pool has served as the site for two Virginia State Championship meets and one Metro Conference Championship.

War Memorial Gym itself houses numerous other facilities including saunas, weight rooms, racquetball courts and six basketball courts. The Hokies also have the use of other equipment such as powerracks for strength swimming and VASA trainers, VASA climbers and bicycles for dry land.

War Memorial Pool, home of the Hokie swim team, was originally built in the early 1920s, but was renovated and moved in March of 1975.

Since then, numerous records at the pool have come and gone, but some have lasted longer than others. Tech's 400 freestyle relay team set the mark on Jan. 16, 1991 and it remains the oldest record on the books.

Last year, four women's pool records were broken, two of which were broken by Hokies (Jill Turner & 800 freestyle relay). The men had eight War Memorial Pool records broken, four of which were by members of the Tech team. Greg Kubovcik, Joey Piekarski, Rob Duffy and the 800 freestyle relay team set those records.

## **Athletic Training**

The Virginia Tech Sports Medicine Department is an ever-changing and developing unit that strives to provide the most current and comprehensive care to all student-athletes.

The department, under the leadership of Gunnar Brolinson, D.O., Delmas Bolin, M.D., and Mike Goforth, director of athletic training, is constantly evolving to incorporate new ideas and state-of-the-art resources for the betterment of student-athletes.

A professional staff — including primary care physicians who are Board certified in family medicine and sports medicine, orthopaedic surgeons, certified athletic trainers, physical therapists, chiropractors, massage therapists, sports psychologists, nutritionists and orthotists — is available to manage the health care of athletes.

As part of the evolution, Tech recently completed the Eddie Ferrell Memorial Training Room. This 4,300-square-foot area consolidated the training rooms that existed in the Merryman Center and Cassell Coliseum. The new facility gives the training staff a centralized area to care for the needs of all Virginia Tech student-athletes. There is state-of-the-art equipment and a unique style of architecture in the facility.

The new room, which nearly doubles the size of the former Merryman Center facility, also allows the staff to utilize that room for physical therapy, chiropractic care and massage therapy. Virginia Tech now has more than 10,000 square feet dedicated to sports medicine, placing Tech in the top five percent nationally.

In addition, the \$10 million Merryman Center, a state-ofthe-art facility which includes 2,400 square feet of medical space, will supplement the new training room.

This treatment room has numerous treatment modalities including electric stimulation, ultrasound, hot packs and interferential current. It also has an office for the staff, dozens of training tables, whirlpools, rehabilitation equipment and two cold tubs. In addition, a new training room has been constructed in Rector Field House and serves the teams when they practice there.

The training, medical and strength and conditioning staffs each have a role in bringing the athlete back quickly and ready to play. After an injury, an athlete will go through rehabilitation and physical therapy. Athletes are then moved to weight training as they become able. The strength and conditioning staff uses specific programs for each injury in an effort to get the athlete back quickly.

The range of benefits athletes have access to include custom orthotics, custom mouth guards, specialized prophylactic bracing and many other options to help prevent or protect them from injuries.

A vital part of studentathletes services is the access to the Schiffert Student Health Center in McComas Hall. A health center and counseling services are available on one side of McComas Hall, while recreation sports and fitness programs are available on the other. The center also has a fully-operational diagnostic laboratory, X-ray facilities and eight full-time physicians.

Student-athletes can also go to Schiffert Student Health Center to be seen by a practitioner or see an orthopaedic surgeon, if necessary. If physical therapy is needed, student-athletes can rehab at the Merryman Center.

Staff psychologists, located in the Cook Counseling Center, are also available to all student-athletes for personal and performance issues.

There are five Certified Athletic Trainers assisted by a staff of seven graduate assistants and 15 student trainers in caring for Tech's 21 varsity sports.

## **Student-Athlete Academic Support Services**

The success of Virginia Tech's athletic program rests largely on the academic progress of each student-athlete. The academic performance of Tech student-athletes has improved each year due in part to the Student-Athlete Academic Support Services (SAASS).

Chris Helms, in his fourth year at Tech, is responsible for the development and leadership of the SAASS office. Helms oversees an office comprised of associate directors Lois Berg and Colin Howlett, assistant directors Katie Ammons, Renia Edwards, Becky Kolenbrander and Drew Scales, and secretary Terrie Repass. Berg oversees the academic progress of the swimming and diving teams.

Student-athletes devote many hours to practice, conditioning and training that are not required of all students. Due to their time commitment and their high visibility, it is an obligation and in the best interest of

the university to supply these students with services which will allow them to maximize their academic potential.

SAASS provides programming for all student-athletes from their freshman year through graduation. This includes a comprehensive orientation to Tech, study hall, mentoring, tutoring, academic monitoring, academic recognition and eligibility education. Additionally, student-athletes are referred to and encouraged to take advantage of other campus agencies charged with helping students in their academic pursuits.

Academic facilities for student-athletes include the Monogram Room, a large room used as a study hall adjacent to the SAASS office in Cassell Coliseum. The HEAT Lab (Hokies Engaging in Advanced Technology) houses over 26 computers on the second floor of Cassell Coliseum and laptop computers are also available for Tech

athletes to use when traveling to away contests.

The athletic department also provides

areas for private, quiet study for the athletes' convenience.

Additionally, studentathletes can use the Center for Academic Enrichment and Excellence site offices, located in Hillcrest and Femoyer Halls.

With the help of these resources, the Virginia Tech graduation rate for student-athletes has risen significantly in recent years and reached 71 percent in 2002 as compared to the national average of 58 percent. The 71 percent student-athlete graduation rate marks the fourth time in nine years that Tech has reached that level.

### Athletic Performance

Thanks to the direction of Assistant Athletics Director for Athletic Performance Mike Gentry, the Virginia Tech strength and conditioning program is among the best in the nation.

Gentry is in his 15th year as the Hokies' director of strength and conditioning. His duties include overseeing the strength and

conditioning training of athletes in all 21 varsity sports at Virginia Tech. A native of Durham, N.C., Gentry received a bachelor's degree in physical education from Western Carolina University in 1979 and a master's from the

University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill in 1981. He received his doctorate in curriculum and instruction, with an emphasis in motor behavior, from Virginia Tech in 1999. In 1995 and 1996, Gentry was recognized by the National Strength and Conditioning Association as a finalist for the National Strength and Conditioning Professional of the Year.

The swimming and diving team trains in the Jim "Bulldog" Haren Weight Room. Located in Jamerson Athletic Center, the Haren Weight Room is a 5,000-square foot weight room officially dedicated in September 1985 to Haren, a former Hokie player and long-time supporter of the Virginia Tech Athletics Department.

Assisting Gentry in the weight room this year are three full-time assistant strength

and conditioning coaches: Jay Johnson, assistant director of strength and conditioning, Terry Mitchell, strength and conditioning coordinator of men's Olympic sports, and Emily Chones, strength and conditioning coordinator for women's Olympic sports. Gentry will also have the services of five graduate assistants — Erin O'Neil, Lisa Guarneri, Keith Short, Gabe Teeple and Ken Oxendine.

#### **Sports Nutrition**

A new program was added to the athletics department in July 2000 — sports nutrition. The department is continually evolving to best serve the student-athlete.

In July 2002, Amy Freel, former coordinator of student life, became the full-time sports nutritionist in the Athletics Department.

Freel works one-on-one with studentathletes to provide them with information that they need on their diets. She also

provides individual players with diet counseling on issues such as gaining lean muscle mass, losing body fat, and how to eat to improve performance.

#### **Sports Psychology**

Another addition to the athletics department as of August 2000 is sports psychology. The licensed psychologists, Dr. Gary Bennett and Dr. Robert Miller, associate director of the Thomas E. Cook Counseling Center, counsel studentathletes either individually or as a team.

The psychologists meet with studentathletes on an individual basis for personal counseling, performance enhancement and to discuss the mental aspects of the game. As a team, the sports psychologists work on team building, communication and performance enhancement.

The psychologists also offer an injury group to afford injured athletes the opportunity to meet with other injured athletes and talk about their recovery process.

Injured athletes may also meet individually with the sports psychologists if they do not feel comfortable in the group or cannot make the sessions. On average, the psychologists conduct 20 individual sessions per week.
