rector field house



FACILITY TO UNDERGO MAJOR IMPROVEMENTS

The Virginia Tech Board of Visitors approved multiple enhancements to Rector Field House at its August 2016 meeting, including the construction of a throws area for the highly successful Hokie track & field program.

There will be several major areas of improvements, but the largest and most visible will be the construction of an indoor throws area. The addition will feature two throws areas, one for the weight throw and one for the shot put. The addition will be connected to the main arena and will be used for both practice and competition.

“The renovation of Rector Field House will provide our program with an outstanding, updated facility which will enhance the recruitment and training of our student-athletes as well as create a great environment for our home competitions,” Dave Cianelli, Director of Track & Field at Virginia Tech said. “The commitment to this project by [Director of Athletics] Whit Babcock demonstrates that our administration not only expects our program to be competitive nationally, but is willing to give us a first class facility to support those efforts.”

A new North wing will be added to Rector that will include increased storage for track. Further enhancements will include a new roof, new lighting and a new surface for the track. The enhancements to Rector will add approximately 32,000 square feet to the structure.

Improvements to Rector Field House have been designed by Cannon Designs, with Branch and Associates of Salem, Virginia doing the construction. Total cost for softball and Rector Field House improvements is expected to be \$18 million.

WHAT'S A HOKIE?

The answer leads all the way back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute. With the change came the necessity for writing a new cheer


and a contest for such a purpose was held by the student body.

Senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his “Hokie” yell which is still used today. Later, when asked if “Hokie” had any special meaning, Stull explained the word was solely the product of his imagination and was used only as an attention-getter for his yell. It soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics.

The official university school colors—Chicago Maroon and Burnt Orange—also were introduced in 1896. The colors were chosen by a committee because they made a ‘unique combination’ not worn elsewhere at the time. The official definition of “Hokie” is “a loyal Virginia Tech Fan.”



johnson miller track complex



The Johnson-Miller Track Complex serves as the outdoor home for the Tech men's and women's track and field teams. The facility sits adjacent to Tech's Rector Field House, which houses the indoor track, and is another piece in Virginia Tech's commitment to a top-tier track and field program.


CROSS COUNTRY COURSE

The Virginia Tech cross country team holds most of its practices and its home meets on the Virginia Tech Cross Country Course, located on the Tech campus adjacent to Smithfield Plantation.

Tech has the luxury of competing and training on a course designed solely for cross country competition, affording the team an opportunity to have exclusive rights to the use of the facility. The all-grass course provides an ideal surface for racing and training. Located on the southwest end of campus near the corner of Southgate Drive and U.S. 460, the course guides runners through a rural terrain of meadows, cornfields and wooded locations typical of the Tech surroundings. The course was built and opened for racing in 1993.



olympic sports weight room



The athletics department opened a brand new, \$1 million Olympic sports training center in 2012 dedicated solely for the Hokies' Olympic sports, thanks to a donation from the family of W.A. and Mae Street, originally from Grundy, Va.

The Olympic Sports Athletic Performance Center features more than 6,000 square feet filled with weights, barbells, weight racks and other assorted equipment designed to help one get stronger, bigger and faster. The new center also features an 1,800 square-foot mezzanine level designed with equipment to help enhance the functional movement of Tech's athletes and thus prevent injuries.




[Competing in America's Top Conference]



The 2015-16 campaign turned out to be a fantastic one for Tech's track and field and cross country teams, as the men's squad captured the ACC title at the ACC Outdoor Track and Field Championships. Behind Thomas Curtin's two gold medals (5,000 and 10,000 meters) and gold medals from Chris Uhle (pole vault) and Matija Muhar (javelin), the Hokies scored 129 points en route to Tech's second outdoor title as a program and sixth overall for the men in track and field and cross country. The men's squad went on to finish eighth at the 2016 NCAA Division I Outdoor Track and Field Championships for its third top-10 finish in six years.

The Hokies' 2015-16 season got off to a great start when runner Thomas Curtin won the ACC's individual cross country title, becoming the program's second individual ACC cross country champion. Curtin went on to become an All-American in all three disciplines (cross country, indoor track and outdoor track), earning a total of six All-America nods to make him the most decorated runner in Virginia Tech history. Behind Curtin, the Tech men's cross country squad received an at-large berth to the NCAA championships – just its second NCAA appearance since 1987. The Hokies finished 27th as a team, while Curtin placed 22nd overall.


