Three Hokies Going to NCAAs

Three Virginia Tech wrestlers will be participating in the 2002 NCAA Division I Wrestling Championships this year thanks to their performances at the Eastern Wrestling League Tournament.

Sean Gray won his 141-pound weight class and Scott Justus captured his 184-pound class at the EWL Tournament.

The newcomer to the group is freshman David Hoffman, who received one of nine wildcard selections from the coaches following the tournament. He went 27-8 in his first collegiate season.

The Hokies, ranked 15th in the nation in the latest InterMat Wrestling tournament team poll, have finished in the top 20 the past two seasons and will need strong performances to once again accomplish that feat.

Hokies in the Rankings

Currently, all three qualifiers from Tech are ranked nationally.

Scott Justus is ranked No. 1 in the nation by both InterMat and *Amateur Wrestling News*.

Sean Gray is ranked second in the InterMat Wrestling poll and is ranked third by *Amateur Wrestling News* at 141 pounds.

Freshman David Hoffman moved into the rankings this past week and enters the NCAA Championships ranked 20th by InterMat Wrestling.

Unbeaten On The Season

Scott Justus has put together one of the best seasons on record for a Virginia Tech wrestler. He is currently 29-0 on the season after winning the EWL title at 184 pounds.

The junior from Grundy, Va., ended the regular season with a 26-0 record, making him the first regular Tech starter on the wrestling team to finish the regular season undefeated since Brandon Glover accomplished this feat in 1960.

Record Breaker

Sean Gray will go down as one of the top wrestlers ever to wrestle at Virginia Tech, as the senior from Flemington, N.J., holds numerous school records.

He is Tech's all-time leader in career wins with 131. He also is tied for career dual meet victories with 58. Gray also holds the mark for pins in a season with 14 and career pins with 44.

The two-time All-American also holds the record for career winning percentage (.885) and singleseason winning percentage (.930 in 1999-2000 with a 40-3 record).

Returning NCAA Qualifiers

Last season, the Hokies had four wrestlers qualify for the NCAA Championships. This year, two of those four return.

Gray became the first Tech wrestler ever to earn All-America

SEAN GRAY



141 Pounds • Senior • Flemington, N.J. 29-3 • Two-Time All-American

One of the top wrestlers in the nation ... A two-time All-American, a first in Tech wrestling ... Expected to contend for the national title ... A gifted athlete ... Enters the 2002 NCAA Championships ranked third in the nation by *Amateur Wrestling News* ... Is fourth in the InterMat Wrestling poll ... Is first on Tech's all-time victories list with 131 ... Is tied for the all-time wins record in dual meets with 58 ... Is Tech's all-time leader in pins with 44 ... Went undefeated in three years of EWL action ... Owns three EWL titles and four overall conference titles ... Has a career record of 131-17 for a winning percentage of 88.6 percent.

2001-02: Has posted a 29-3 record up to this point ... Went 14-1 in dual meets and 7-0 in EWL matches ... Captured his third Eastern Wrestling League title with three wins ... Scored 65 points for the team in dual meets and 31 in EWL matches ... Has 14 falls, two technical falls and four major decisions ... Won his weight class at both the Penn State Open and Virginia State Championships, being named the most outstanding wrestler both times ... Only losses came to nationally-ranked Shane Cunanan of West Virginia, No. 3 Chad Erikson of Minnesota and No. 3 Mark Conley of Navy ... Dropped a 4-1 decision to Conley at the NWCA All-State Meet.

2000-01: Finished sixth in the nation, garnering All-America honors once again ... Hurt his knee in his semifinal match of the NCAA Championships, forcing him to take medical forfeits on the final day ... Went 30-3 overall on the year, 16-0 in dual meets and 7-0 in Eastern Wrestling League matches ... Won his 141-pound weight class at the EWL Tournament for the second consecutive year ... Qualified for the NCAA Championships for the third time ... Had six major decisions, four technical falls and seven falls ... Also won the Navy Classic and placed second at the Las Vegas Open ... Won the EWL title for most points scored in



EWL dual meets ... Only losses on the year came to No. 3 Michael Lightner of Arizona State in Las Vegas and No. 1 Doug Schwab of Iowa at the NWCA All-Star Classic and at the NCAA Championships.

1999-00: Placed seventh at the NCAA Championships ... Earned All-America honors ... Also won his weight class at the Navy Classic, Sheridan Classic, Virginia State Championships and EWL Championships ... Went 40-3 overall and 8-0 in the EWL ... Winning percentage was third highest in school history.

1998-99: Sat out the season for a redshirt ... Won the 138-pound weight class at the Junior National Championships over the summer ... Finished sixth at the World Championships in Australia.

1997-98: Posted one of the best seasons in school history as a freshman ... Was one victory short of All-America honors at the NCAA Championships ... Completed his spectacular freshman season with a 32-8 record, the sixth best in Tech history for wins in a season ... Captured the CAA title at 134 pounds ... Was a perfect 5-0 in CAA dual meets ... Named CAA Rookie of the Year ... Went 12-1 in dual meets ... Had a team-best 14 falls ... Recorded 61 points in dual meets and 27 in CAA dual meets ... Won the 134-pound title at the North Carolina Open ... Finished in second place at the Navy Classic, Sheridan Invitational and Virginia State Championships ... Went 3-2 at the NCAA Championships ... Opened the tournament with a 6-5 decision over 12th-seeded Jeff Bucher of Ohio State ... Lost to Northwestern's Scott Schatzman in the second round before defeating Wyoming's Bryce Bochy and Minnesota's Troy Marr in the wrestleback round ... Lost to Mark Angle of Clarion in the placing round ... Seven of his eight losses came to nationally-ranked wrestlers.

High School: Was the team captain for the national champion Blair Academy ... Was the 1995 Cadet National Freestyle champion ... Finished seventh in Junior Nationals ... Earned top honors at the 1997 Reno Tournament of Champions ... Three-time National Prep Tournament champion ... First person in New Jersey history to win the Cadet Nationals.



133 Pounds • Freshman 27-8 • Spring City, Pa.



2001-02: Took the collegiate wrestling scene by storm as a freshman ... Struggled late, but still managed to earn a wildcard selection to the Championships ... Enters the NCAA Championships with a 27-8 record ... Placed sixth at the EWL Tournament ... Won his weight class at the Virginia State Championships ... Also placed third at the Navy Classic and fifth at the Penn State Open ... Went 12-3 in dual meets and 4-3 in EWL matches ... Scored 58 points for the team in dual meets ... 

184 Pounds • Junior • Grundy, Va. 29-0 • Three-time NCAA Qualifier

Was one round away from All-America status at last year's NCAA Championships ... Coaches are looking for him to be an All-American this year ... A proven returning veteran ... Hard-nosed competitor with a tremendous work ethic ... Comes from a rich wrestling background ... Enters the NCAA Championships ranked No. 1 in the nation by both InterMat Wrestling and *Amateur Wrestling News* ... Became the first regular starter in Tech wrestling to post a perfect regular season since Brandon Glover did it in the 1959-60 season.

2001-02: Made a quick ascent up the national polls with his 26-0 regular season mark ... Captured his first Eastern Wrestling League title with three wins ... EntersThe Championships with a perfect record ... Went 15-0 in dual meets and 7-0 in EWL action ... Recorded eight major decisions, three technical falls and six falls ... Wen his weight class at the Navy Classic, Penn State Open and Virginia State Championships ... Began the season ranked in the top 10, but surprised everyone with his season ... Picked up a big, sudden-victory win over nationally-ranked Damion Hahn in a dual meet at home ... Closest call came against unranked Matt Benton of Pitt-Johnstown, where he had to go to overtime to remain perfect ... Scored 66 points for the team in dual meets ... Earned 27 points for the Hokies in EWL meets.



KEITH MOURLAM



Head Coach • 6th year University of Iowa • 1977

Since taking over the Virginia Tech wrestling program prior to the 1997 season, head coach Keith Mourlam has turned Tech into a national-caliber program, capable of contending for conference titles and putting top-notch wrestlers on the mat against quality opponents.

In five years, he has led the Hokies to league championships, coached numerous league champions and helped Sean Gray and Chris Martin earn All-America honors.

Recognized nationally for his feats, Mourlam was named *Amateur Wrestling News'* Rookie Coach of the Year in 1997 and Colonial Athletic Association Coach of the Year in 1998.

Last year, he led the Hokies to another top-25 finish at the NCAA Championships as Gray once again earned All-America honors. Couple that with the strongest recruiting class in recent history and Mourlam has the Hokies on the path to greatness.

Every coach dreams of the opportunity to build an athletic program from the ground up, which is virtually what Mourlam has accomplished in his four short years at the helm. With a final record of 10-8 in 1997, Mourlam became the first Tech head coach to lead his squad to a season finish above .500 and earn double-digit wins in his inaugural year.

In the 1999-2000 season, Mourlam led the Hokies to a 10-7 overall record, a third-place finish in the Eastern Wrestling League and a 19th-place finish at the NCAA Championships. Five of his wrestlers qualified for the NCAAs while Gray and Martin earned All-America honors. For his efforts, Mourlam was named both the Virginia state and EWL Coach of the Year.

A championship wrestler at the University of Iowa — one of the top wrestling programs in the nation — Mourlam began his first year as the head wrestling coach at Virginia Tech after serving as coach Jerry Cheynet's top assistant during the 1995-96 season. As the recruiting coordinator during that year, Mourlam signed an outstanding recruiting class which earned accolades from *Amateur Wrestling News* as the 21st-best incoming class in the nation, a first for a Tech wrestling team.

Four years ago, Mourlam guided Tech to a 9-4 record, a perfect 5-0 mark in the CAA, the CAA dual-meet title, the CAA Tournament title and sent four wrestlers to the NCAA Championships.

During Mourlam's first season as head coach, John Dattalo and Eric Hall earned bids to the NCAA Championships after winning their respective weight classes at the Colonial Athletic Association Tournament, while Martin claimed one of only two wild-card selections.

Mourlam tutored Dattalo and Hall to conference honors as well during the 1996-97 season as Dattalo was named the Colonial Athletic Association's Wrestler of the Year and Hall earned Rookie of the Year honors. In addition to CAA awards, the standout freshmen, Hall and Martin, garnered spots on

Amateur Wrestling News' Freshman All-America Team at their respective weight classes.

Mourlam continues to put Virginia Tech wrestling on the map as the Hokies accepted an invitation four years ago to join the highly-competitive Eastern Wrestling League.

Mourlam had the opportunity to use his coaching expertise in national competition as he served as the head coach for the United States freestyle team at the Pan American Games in Winnipeg, Canada in 1998. The previous year he served as the assistant coach for the United States Senior team at the Pan American Games in San Juan, Puerto Rico.

Mourlam came to Tech as a standout coach and collegiate wrestler. The 1977 lowa graduate has been a part of four NCAA Championship teams — two as a student-athlete in 1975 and '76, and two as the assistant coach at his alma mater in 1985 and '86. During his senior year, Mourlam was the Big Ten Conference champion and runner-up for the NCAA title at 126 pounds.

Following his illustrious college career, Mourlam continued competing and was a two-time United States Wrestling Federation freestyle champion in 1981 and '82. During those two years, he traveled as a member of an international team competing in Germany, Cuba and Hungary.

Immediately out of college, Mourlam became the assistant coach at the University of Northern Iowa for a two-year stint. He then moved on to assist nationally-recognized head coach Dan Gable at his alma mater, Iowa, for three years. Gaining considerable experience with a highly respected coach and collegiate program, Mourlam worked as an assistant from 1984 until 1987 when he took over the position of administrative assistant. In that position, Mourlam had the opportunity to run the Dan Gable Training Camps.

"Keith is very intense and knows the sport inside and out," former lowa head coach Dan Gable said. "He is an excellent teacher and has a great ability to communicate his knowledge of the sport to his athletes. Keith has been around championship teams and knows what it takes to win. He will do an excellent job at Virginia Tech."

Mourlam was named the Wrestling Coach of the Year for Division II & III Virginia collegiate state champion Newport News Apprentice School for two consecutive years in 1994 and 1995. He was head coach there until accepting the assistant job at Tech.

Mourlam expanded his coaching expertise from the collegiate ranks to international competition beginning in 1992 when he was the assistant coach of the Senior United States wrestling team. Among his long list of coaching accomplishments, Mourlam has acted as the head coach of the championship East team in the 1994 Olympic Festival, head coach of the 1995 USA Senior Freestyle team and head coach of the 1995 USA World Espior Freestyle team.
