


Hokies Travel To Lock Haven For EWL Tournament

The Virginia Tech wrestling team takes to the road for the annual Eastern Wrestling League Tournament, which will be held at Lock Haven, Pa., this year.

Some of the nation's finest wrestlers will converge on the tiny Pennsylvania town, including a defending NCAA champion, five returning All-Americans and 12 wrestlers ranked in the top 10 in the nation, according to the Feb. 26 InterMat Wrestling poll.

West Virginia, Lock Haven, Pittsburgh and Edinboro will be the favorites heading in. The Fighting Scots of EUP have won the last four tournament titles.

For the Hokies, Sean Gray and Scott Justus will enter the tournament as the No. 1 seed at their respective weight classes. Gray, a two-time EWL champion, will be challenged by Mike Maney of Lock Haven and Shane Cunanan of West Virginia at 141 pounds.

Justus, who took second at 184

pounds last season, will be challenged by Josh Millard of Lock Haven. Justus beat Millard, 6-5, earlier in the year in a tight contest.

The Season Thus Far

The Hokies went 5-10 overall and 1-6 in the tough Eastern Wrestling League. The young team features only two returning starters from a year ago and seven of the regular starters weren't even at Tech last season.

Tech started the season out on the road at No. 11 Edinboro. The Hokies made it surprisingly close, but fell 22-15. Tech rebounded by defeating Gardner-Webb, 43-7, on the road.

The annual trip to the Navy Classic yielded a third-place team finish while Scott Justus won the 184-pound weight class.

At the Penn State Open, Justus again won his weight class while Sean Gray was named the tournament's Most Outstanding Wrestler after winning his 141-pound class.

After a 42-9 loss to top-ranked Minnesota and a tough 23-18 setback to No. 12 Lock Haven, the Hokies bounced back to down Bloomsburg, 28-13, in Blacksburg.

At the Virginia Duals, the Hokies opened with a loss to North Carolina, but came to beat Virginia, 21-18, when David Hoffman came from behind to win his match in the final bout. The Hokies finished the Duals with a 30-13 setback to No. 20 Pittsburgh.

At the Virginia State Meet, five Hokies (Gray, Hoffman, Justus, Geoff Head and Canaan Prater) won their respective weight class as Tech cruised to the team title.

After a 26-16 loss to No. 21 Pittsburgh at home, the Hokies trounced Appalachian State on the road, winning 37-12. After a tough loss to Division II power Pitt-Johnstown and a 29-9 loss to No. 11 West Virginia, the Hokies took to the road for another match against in-state rival Virginia.

With pins from Justus, Hoffman and Gray, as well as a decision from Prater, the Hokies led 21-6 with four matches to go. The Cavaliers fought valiantly, but in the end, the Hokies held on for an exciting 21-19 victory.

Tech ended the season on the road, falling to Clarion and Cleveland State.

Hokies in the Rankings

Currently, Virginia Tech has two wrestlers ranked nationally.

Sean Gray is ranked second in the nation in the Feb. 26 InterMat poll and third by *Amateur Wrestling News* at 141 pounds. He is 26-3 on the season and 14-1 in dual meets.

Scott Justus is ranked second in the nation by InterMat and checks in at No. 3 in the *AWN* poll. The junior is 26-0 on the season, capturing the 184-pound titles at the Navy Classic, Virginia State Meet and Penn State Open. He is the first regular starter on the Tech wrestling team to go through a regular season undefeated since Brandon Glover did it in the 1959-60 season.

Freshman David Hoffman, who is 26-5 overall, 12-3 in dual meets, has been ranked in the top 25 by both polls, but is currently unranked.

Fabulous Freshman

There are a lot of new faces on this year's Virginia Tech squad. With five transfers and 13 freshmen on the roster, plus only two starters returning, things were looking rough for the Hokies.

What most didn't count on was a fresh face stepping up and making a big impact right away.

That freshman has been David Hoffman. The five-time Pennsylvania state high school champion and two-time national prep champion came in as one the best signees ever at Tech. And he hasn't disappointed.

In his first collegiate match, the 133-pounder pinned eighth-ranked Cory Ace of Edinboro. He has posted a record of 26-5 overall, 4-3 in EWL matches and 12-3 in dual meets. He was ranked as high as 17th in the nation by InterMat and 18th by AWN.

Transfers Chipping In

Tech welcomed five new faces to the squad this year via transfer. They are Pete Pool, Mike Cox, Michael Carr and twins Geoff and Dalton Head.

Geoff Head has been a pleasant surprise, where he is 16-10 at 125 pounds. The sophomore transferred from James Madison, where he started a year ago. His brother, Dalton, a 133-pounder, also transferred from JMU and is redshirting this year.

Mike Cox came in from

Campbell, where he posted a 12-14 record. He is currently 8-15 this year as the 157-pounder.

Michael Carr was the starter at 197 pounds before suffering a shoulder injury. The University of Pennsylvania transfer went 5-4.

The last transfer is also the oldest member of the team at 29. Pete Pool, who went to Lower Columbia Community College before enrolling in the Marines, has come in and grabbed the heavyweight spot. He went 10-18 in his first year back.

Senior Sean Gray has a chance to rewrite the Tech wrestling record book if he finishes up his final season in strong fashion. He is Tech's only two-time wrestling All-American and enters the EWL Tourney ranked second in the country at 141 pounds.

He is already the school record holder in single season winning percentage with a .930 clip in the 1999-2000 season (40-2 record), as well as career winning percentage — .883 heading into this weekend.

He also is tops on the list for career dual meet wins. He finished his career with a mark of 58-3. The 58 wins ties him for first all-time at Tech.

With a win over Starlin Jimenez of Clarion on Feb. 16, he became Tech's all-time leader in career victories with 127. He heads into the postseason with a career mark of 128-17.

He is also tops at Tech in career pins (43) and needs two more pins this season to top his own school mark of 13 pins in a season.

Keith Mourlam Head Coach

Since taking over the Virginia Tech wrestling program prior to the 1997 season, head coach Keith Mourlam has

turned Tech into a national-caliber program, capable of contending for conference titles and putting top-notch wrestlers on the mat against quality opponents.

In five years, he has led the Hokies to league championships, coached numerous league champions and helped Sean Gray and Chris Martin earn All-America honors.

Recognized nationally for his feats, Mourlam was named *Amateur Wrestling News'* Rookie Coach of the Year in 1997 and Colonial Athletic Association Coach of the Year in 1998.

Last year, he led the Hokies to another top-25 finish at the NCAA Championships as Gray once again earned All-America honors. Couple that with the strongest recruiting class in recent history and Mourlam has the Hokies on the path to greatness.

Every coach dreams of the opportunity to build an athletic program from the ground up, which is virtually what Mourlam has accomplished in his four short years at the helm. With a final record of 10-8 in 1997, Mourlam became the first Tech head coach to lead his squad to a season finish above .500 and earn double-digit wins in his inaugural year.

In the 1999-2000 season, Mourlam led the Hokies to a 10-7 overall record, a third-place finish in the Eastern Wrestling League and a 19th-place finish at the NCAA Championships. Five of his wrestlers qualified for the NCAAs while Gray and Martin earned All-America honors. For his efforts, Mourlam was named both the Virginia state and EWL Coach of the

A championship wrestler at the University of Iowa — one of the top wrestling programs in the nation — Mourlam began his first year as the head wrestling coach at Virginia Tech after serving as coach Jerry Cheynet's top assistant during the 1995-96 season. As the recruiting coordinator during that year, Mourlam signed an outstanding recruiting class which earned accolades from *Amateur Wrestling News* as the 21st-best incoming class in the nation, a first for a Tech wrestling team

Four years ago, Mourlam guided Tech to a 9-4 record, a perfect 5-0 mark in the CAA, the CAA dual-meet title, the CAA Tournament title and sent four wrestlers to the NCAA Championships.

During Mourlam's first season as head coach, John Dattalo and Eric Hall earned bids to the NCAA Championships after winning their respective weight classes at the Colonial Athletic Association Tournament, while Martin claimed one of only two wild-card selections.

Mourlam tutored Dattalo and Hall to conference honors as well during the 1996-97 season as Dattalo was named the Colonial Athletic Association's Wrestler of the Year and Hall earned Rookie of the Year honors. In addition to CAA awards,

the standout freshmen, Hall and Martin, garnered spots on *Amateur Wrestling News'* Freshman All-America Team at their respective weight classes.

Mourlam continues to put Virginia Tech wrestling on the map as the Hokies accepted an invitation four years ago to join the highly-competitive Eastern Wrestling League.

Mourlam had the opportunity to use his coaching expertise in national competition as he served as the head coach for the United States freestyle team at the Pan American Games in Winnipeg, Canada in 1998. The previous year he served as the assistant coach for the United States Senior team at the Pan American Games in San Juan, Puerto Rico.

Mourlam came to Tech as a standout coach and collegiate wrestler. The 1977 lowa graduate has been a part of four NCAA Championship teams — two as a student-athlete in 1975 and '76, and two as the assistant coach at his alma mater in 1985 and '86. During his senior year, Mourlam was the Big Ten Conference champion and runner-up for the NCAA title at 126 pounds.

Following his illustrious college career, Mourlam continued competing and was a two-time United States Wrestling Federation freestyle champion in 1981 and '82. During those two years, he traveled as a member of an international team competing in Germany, Cuba and Hungary.

Immediately out of college, Mourlam became the assistant coach at the University of Northern Iowa for a two-year stint. He then moved on to assist nationally-recognized head coach Dan Gable at his alma mater, Iowa, for three years. Gaining considerable experience with a highly respected coach and collegiate program, Mourlam worked as an assistant from 1984 until 1987 when he took over the position of administrative assistant. In that position, Mourlam had the opportunity to run the Dan Gable Training Camps.

"Keith is very intense and knows the sport inside and out," former lowa head coach Dan Gable said. "He is an excellent teacher and has a great ability to communicate his knowledge of the sport to his athletes. Keith has been around championship teams and knows what it takes to win. He will do an excellent job at Virginia Tech."

Mourlam was named the Wrestling Coach of the Year for Division II & III Virginia collegiate state champion Newport News Apprentice School for two consecutive years in 1994 and 1995. He was head coach there until accepting the assistant job at Tech.

Mourlam expanded his coaching expertise from the collegiate ranks to international competition beginning in 1992 when he was the assistant coach of the Senior United States wrestling team. Among his long list of coaching accomplishments, Mourlam has acted as the head coach of the championship East team in the 1994 Olympic Festival, head coach of the 1995 USA Senior Freestyle team and head coach of the 1995 USA World Espior Freestyle team.
